






Miss Suzanne Kolhoff Will Be

The service will be read by Rev. Francis D. McCrae, pastor of the Irvington Episcopal church, before members of the immediate family and a few close friends.


The bride will wear a gown of French blue lace, made with a fitted blue with normal waistline marked
