

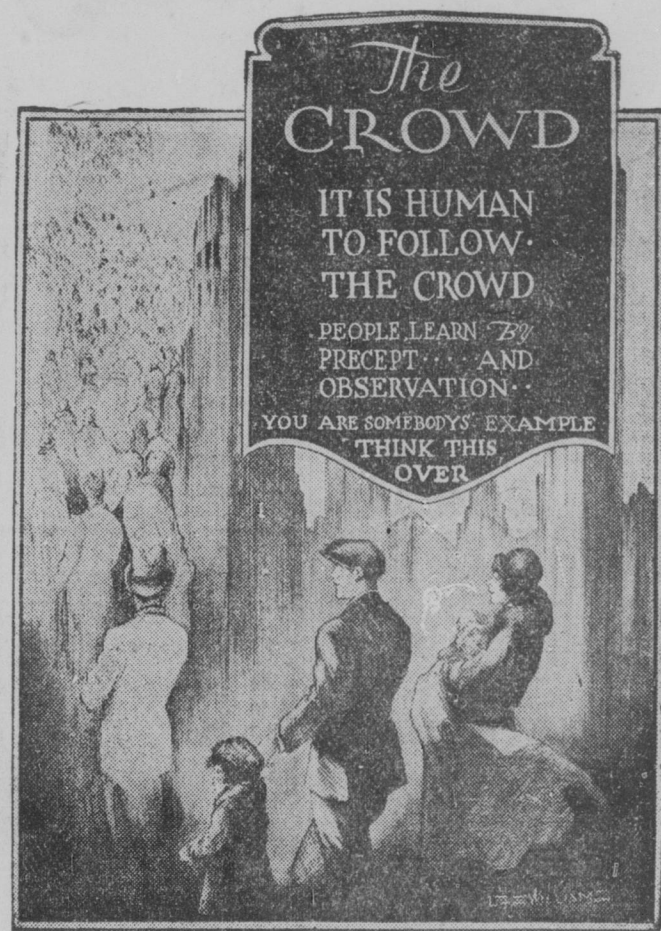
This Is One of a Series on the Subject of "Taxpayers vs. Crime"

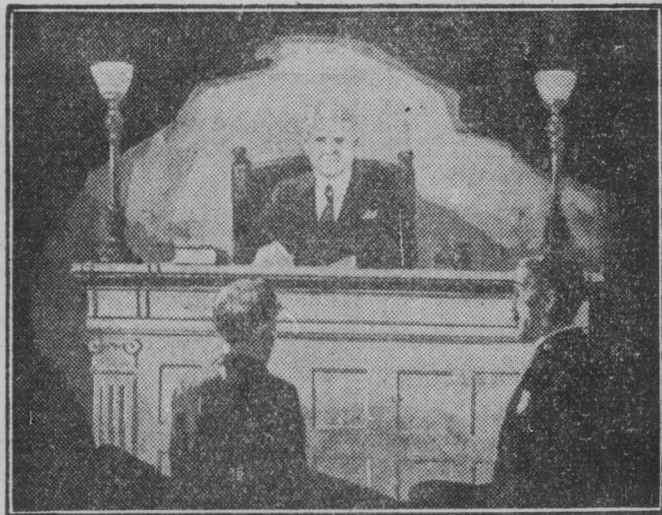
WHEN the time comes for the club and the handcuffs it is then too late. Most of the crimes committed by juveniles are the result of no moral or ethical training in the home.
