

CHURCH TRIAL OF CANNON IS NEARING CRISIS

Bishop Fights Desperately
Against Accusation,
Despite Illness.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5.—Preliminary of the ecclesiastical investigation of Bishop James Cannon III. have been concluded and the inquiry turned today to the more serious charges against this turbulent figure in prohibition, religious and political affairs.

As the hearings approached the crisis upon which hinges the future of the 67-year-old churchman, there was an apparent tightening of the tension among the twelve church elders charged with weighing the evidence and reaching a verdict.

Cannon, fighting desperately, despite his illness, has attended every session since the inquiry began two days ago. He sat through a three-hour hearing Wednesday night after making two previous trips during the day to and from the hospital, where he has undergone treatment for arthritis.

Surrounded by his sons, Cannon hobbles on crutches in and out of the Mt. Vernon place church where the secret sessions are being held. James Cannon III is his principal adviser, but David and Edward usually are present also.

Cannon's associates have made no effort to create sympathy for him by emphasizing his physical weakness.

Dr. Porter J. Prentiss is leading the prosecution as one of the four elders who questioned Cannon during the period of his first wife's illness and death are to be considered next.

Four witnesses were heard Wednesday and more were expected today.

LAST TOUCHES BEING PUT ON TAX MEASURE

House Committee Expected to Hand Down Reports on Proposals.

Finishing touches were being put on personal and corporate income tax measures by the ways and means committee of the house today, preparatory to their being reported out for passage, probably Friday.

Enactment of the two measures, it is claimed, would raise approximately \$7,500,000 annually, or about half what the present state levy on property now raises.

House Bills 233, levying a 3 per cent tax on the net incomes of corporations, and 271, taxing personal incomes at from 1 to 4 per cent, are the bills to be reported out as major revenue raising efforts of the current general assembly.

The committee report will recommend amendments, chief of which will be one requiring complete secrecy about both corporate and personal income tax returns. This provision will be drafted into both bills, taken almost bodily from House Bill 205, the Democratic platform income tax measure, which also is in the hands of the ways and means committee.

By agreement of Democratic leaders and the joint tax committee of both houses, Bill 205 probably will be allowed to die in committee, the whole effort of both houses being concentrated on the other two income tax bills into such form that they can be passed and sent to the Governor.

Despite the insistence of senate and house leaders that some means must be found to reduce, or eliminate entirely, the state property tax, there is a persistent opinion among legislators and veteran observers that no drastic change in the state's tax plan will be achieved this session.

CHURCH KEY TO PEACE

Dr. Edwards Urges That Labors Be for International Harmony.

Belief that the church holds the key to international peace was declared by Dr. David M. Edwards, executive secretary of the Indiana Council of International Relations, and former president of Earlham college, Wednesday in a talk at the Y. W. C. A.

"War is intolerable on a spiritual and intellectual basis," Dr. Edwards told the Indianapolis Ministerial Association and Indianapolis Church Federation members. Music was provided by a quartet from Indiana Central College.
