

# GUNMAN FAILS TO OPEN GAS STATION SAFE

Clothing Valued at \$1,000 Taken From Women's Apparel Shop.

As Clifton Phelps, cashier, and George Holey, 701 East Eleventh street, attendant at an oil station at Tenth street and Cornell avenue, checked over receipts early today, a gunman ordered them to open the safe. Neither had the combination, and the bandit took \$10 and drove away.

Burglars smashed a glass rear door and jimmied their way into the Anna Simon Murray shop, 2702 North Meridian street, early today, taking women's garments valued at \$1,000.

Merchant Policeman E. E. Pruitt, 3505 East Walnut street, pursued two men at Washington and Chester street early this morning, and captured one of them, James Newton, 29, Negro, 139 South Sheridan avenue, in the 100 block South Denny street.

Police say Newton confessed robbing a Kroger grocery at 3809 East New York street Wednesday night, and several other groceries in the past, implicating a cafe owner on Indiana avenue as a "fence." Later Joe Tobak, 28, operator of a restaurant and poolroom at 360 Indiana avenue, was arrested on charges of vagrancy and keeping a lottery and gift enterprise. A police squad reported finding baseball tickets, dice and cards in the place. Newton refused to name his confederate, whom police are seeking.

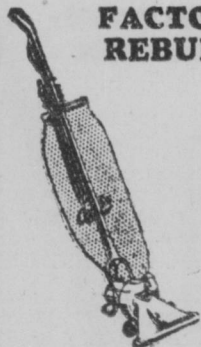
