I must tell you that "Mr. James Hall" was not in but Jimmie Hall was there in person in this flock of rooms. I mean no disrespect but this movie hero of "Hell's Angels" and a bunch of other hits was just Jimmie Hall and not the movie idol. After you meet them, James Hall is that sort of a fellow. You want to call him Jimmie and you do. Everybody was calling him that when I appeared and my last words to him were, "Well, Jim, see you later." So you can see that I even beat the others. I called him Jim.

Hall told me that the questions he is asked the most by people who meet him center around how movies are actually made.

"They ask me how I killed Ben Lyon in 'Hell's Angels,'" then that I actually drove one of those airplanes many times."

One fine thing that I liked about this man, he knows about every one who is anybody at Hollywood and he only had the best to say of them.

He had more than the best of words for Clara Bow and he has acted with Clara, you know, on the screen.

While we talked of Hollywood, he found time to talk about his work in Indianapolis. He found time to shake hands with the manager of the Lincoln.

"I was here in my hotel in 1923 with 'The Passing Show,'" he said. "All the stars stayed at the Lincoln in that show. I was the star."

Then he grew serious and talked of Indianapolis of other days. Hall has done many things in his career on the stage and screen.

This master of ceremonies job which he takes over at the Indiana today is not new to him. He knows his bands.

ISSUE CITY FIGURES

Engineering Data Contained in Annual Report.

Indianapolis motorists drive over 801,841 miles of streets, according to the annual report of A. H. Moore, city civil engineer. Sixty per cent of these are paved, while there are fifty-four miles of boulevards.

The city is nearly thirteen miles long and a little over nine miles in width, the report adds. The total area is 54.15 square miles, not counting the municipal airport.

The 1930 census gives the city's population as 364,161.

City parks are lighted by 2,017 lights, and 7,841 more decorative city streets and the 662 miles of cement walks.

The city's mileage of gas mains is 135 greater than that of cement walks, while the number of miles of water mains and sewers is slightly less. There are 5,763 fire hydrants.
