

MINE CHIEF IS HELD PRISONER FOR FIVE HOURS

Workers, Angered by Delay in Pay, Form Cordon Around Office.

CHICAGO, Feb. 19.—Released from a mob of miners who had held him prisoner in Sesser, Ill., for five hours, W. A. Brewerton, president of the Brewerton Coal Company, returned unharmed to his home today in Libertyville, Ill.

The miners were aroused when Brewerton, receiver for the Interstate Coal Company at Sesser, informed them he was unable to meet the pay roll for the first two weeks in February, although he distributed \$10,000 due on the Jan. 30 pay roll.

Brewerton said the second pay roll ordinarily was not paid until the 20th of the month and that it would be met at that time.

As the news spread in the little mining town, a swarm of workers gathered about the company office shouting threats.

Brewerton barricaded the doors. The miners formed a cordon about the building and shouted that they'd "keep Brewerton there all night or until he gets as hungry as our children."

Deputy sheriffs arrived after five hours and formed a path through the crowd to allow Brewerton to leave. No violence was threatened by the workers and no arrests were made.

Clew Indicates Miner Kidnaped San Diego Girl

LOS ANGELES, Feb. 19.—Deputy sheriffs went into the mountains back of Saugus today to trace the first definite clew to the whereabouts of Virginia Brooks, 10, missing from her San Diego home for eight days.

Virginia was believed to be in the company of a miner who was said to have been a close friend of the missing girl's father. The suspect's name, although known, was withheld.

Officers stumbled on the clew when they investigated a report that Virginia was seen in Los Angeles last Thursday morning with an elderly man. The car was registered by a Pomona (Cal.) man, who had purchased it in San Diego a few days before Virginia disappeared.

A search of the man's residence in Pomona showed it had been unoccupied for several days.

GEN. BUTLER WILL GIVE UP SERVICE POST

Intends to Retire Next Fall to Deliver Series of Lectures.

BUFFALO, N. Y., Feb. 19.—Major-General Smedley D. Butler plans to retire from the service next fall, he announced here following an address Wednesday night before the University Club of Buffalo.

He already has notified officials at Washington of his intention he said, and expected no refusal of his application to be filed soon.

"No, I'm not retiring because of the Mussolini incident," he told questioners, who attempted to learn more of the abandoning of his court-martial for the speech in which he implied the Italian premier was a hit and run driver.

"I'm going to deliver a series of lectures between October, 1931, and May, 1932," he said.

He signed a contract Wednesday with Louis J. Albers, president of the Albers lecture bureau at Cleveland. His lecture at South Bend Tuesday and here were under Albers' direction.
