**COMMUNISTS EXPEL,
U. S. TO DEPORT MAN**

Party Drops Laborer for Refusing to Use Negro's Bath Tub.

NEW YORK, March 3.—August Yokenen, janitor of a Finnish workers' club in Harlem, was expelled from the Communist party for "white chauvinism" because he refused to use the same bath tub with a Negro, found himself in new trouble today, this time with the United States immigration authorities.

He was reported to have been arrested yesterday on a deportation warrant, less than twenty-four hours after his expulsion from the Communist organization in the first mass trial conducted by the Communists in this country.

Officials of the International Labor Defense said efforts would be made today to obtain his release on bail.
