Great sums of money are spent annually in building for the future.

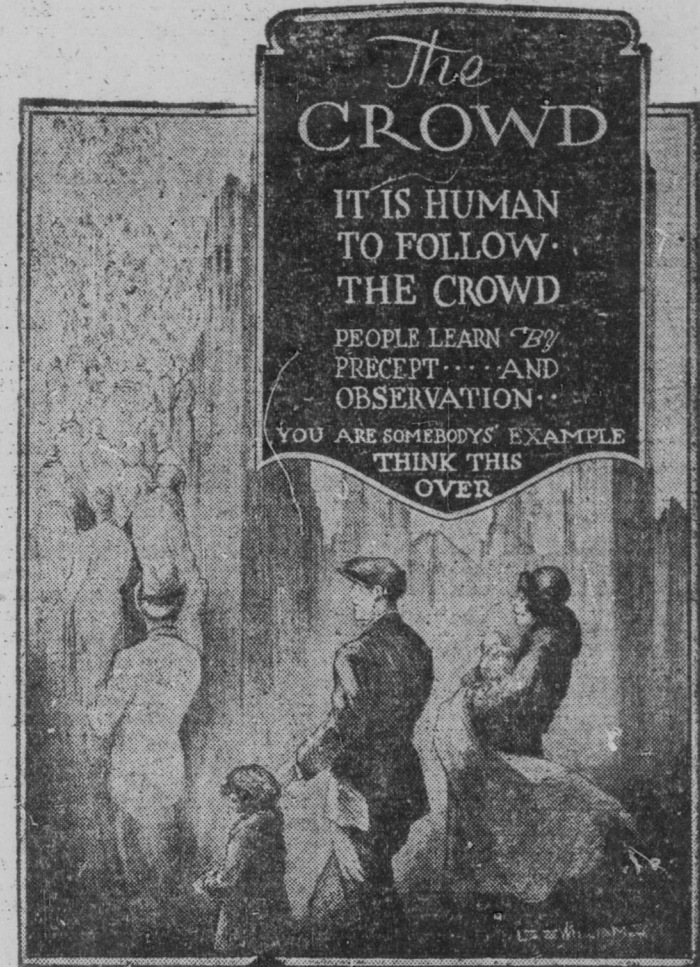
