

BROKER SLUGS SONS WITH AX; KILLS HIMSELF

Boys, 12 and 9, in Critical Condition: Losses in Stock Market Blamed.

HONOLULU, T. H., March 27.—Dudley W. Wallace, wealthy New York stock broker, died in a hospital here today of bullet wounds inflicted in a suicide attempt after he had attacked his two sons and fractured their skulls with an ax. The sons, Dudley, 12, and Donald, 9, were in critical condition.

Mrs. Wallace, who discovered the party upon returning home from the exclusive Waikiki district, said her husband had been confined to a New York sanitarium for six weeks after suffering heavy losses in the stock market.

The family came here last July for Wallace's health, she said, and he apparently became normal again. During the last few days, however, she said, he had acted strangely.

Barbara Wallace, 11, at home at the time, described the affair. She said her father came to her bedroom and ordered her downstairs, then entered the bedroom of the two boys.

Hearing sounds of the attack, she rushed upstairs, and saw her father disappear into a bathroom. A few seconds later she heard a shot.

FRANCE FIGHTS PACT

Briand Angry Over Austro-German Agreement.

PARIS, March 27.—Aristide Briand's success in obtaining England's approval of delaying the Austro-German commercial agreement until it is considered by the League of Nations, appeared today to be only a partial victory.

Briand's opponents maintained that England was not alarmed at the Austro-German negotiations, but agreed to consultation of the League to permit France's anger to subside in order that the 1932 world disarmament conference might not be endangered.

FEAR REVENGE AGAINST GROCER FOR SHOOTING

Informant Tells Police of Plot to 'Get' Man Who Wounded Bandit.

Reports of underworld revenge against a grocer who wounded a bandit Tuesday night led police today to search for two men who, according to an informant, are plotting methods to "get even," should the highwayman die.

John Sink, the bandit, still is near death at the city hospital as a result of bullet wounds inflicted by Carey Harlan, operator of a grocery at 3764 West Washington street, after Sink and two other bandits robbed him.

The informer, whose name is being withheld, told police he overheard a conversation of two men in a West Indianapolis shack Thursday afternoon. He said they described the whining of the bullets fired by Harlan and one said he was unable to "make a break" because he could not get under the steering wheel of the auto when it careened after Sink was wounded.

One of the duo said they would "get the groceryman if the boy dies," according to police information.


