

GANG VOLLEY CLAIMS LIFE OF INFORMER

Slain Man Played Part in Conviction of Gambler Rosenthal's Killers.

CHICAGO, March 31.—Max Tandler, a police character in New York and Chicago for years, was killed Monday night by two gunmen who shot him down as he was buying a newspaper at a crowded street corner in the busy uptown district, forty-five blocks outside the loop.

Tandler had been arrested here several times and faced arraignment in federal court April 27 on a charge of possessing narcotics.

It was said he formerly was a police informer in New York and played an important part in convicting Cyp the Blood, Lefty Louis and Police Lieutenant Becker for the murder of Herman Rosenthal, New York gambler.

Several thousand persons were leaving two nearby theaters as Tandler stepped to the news stand. The intersection was packed with humanity for several hundred feet in each direction. Two men edged their way through the crowd.

As Tandler put out his hand to accept the change, the men pressed revolvers against him and began firing. Two bullets entered his head. Three entered his body. He died within a few minutes. The killers escaped through the crowds.

Police say they believe Tandler had been associated with a gang of kidnapers who had collected thousands of dollars in ransom from gamblers and bootleggers.

TEST AUTOS AT HIGHER SPEEDS

Five 1,000-Mile Runs Are Ended at Speedway.

The run of five 1,000-mile test runs at fifty-five miles an hour being conducted at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway, with thirteen stock automobiles, by the A. A. A. and Standard Oil Company, of Indiana was completed early today.

The run followed a break-in run of 2,000 miles at varying speeds and two 1,000-mile runs at thirty miles an hour. The test is for the purpose of determining fuel and oil consumption and wear of moving parts of the cars.

The runs, which will continue until April 10 or 11, start at 8 a. m. one day and end at 2:30 a. m. next day.
