

LIQUOR SOURCE DAMMED WITH STILL SEIZURE

Daily Output of 125 Gallons
of Whisky Is Stopped
in Raid.

A generous source of Indianapolis liquor was wiped out late Thursday when deputy sheriffs raided a residence in Lafayette Heights and confiscated a 300-gallon still with a daily output of 125 gallons of whisky.

Deputies had gone to the home of W. Darnell on information a small still was in operation. The one found, which occupied most of the basement of the house, is one of the largest ever confiscated and dismantled in or near Indianapolis.

Darnell was not at home when the raid was made. Today he is the object of a wide search.

Mrs. Edith Darnell, who was at home with her three small children, admitted to deputies that the still had been erected six weeks ago and had been in operation daily since then, they said.

According to deputies she told them that the 125 gallons of whisky manufactured daily by her husband was sold wholesale in barrel lots to retailers. Ninety-eight gallons of barreled corn whisky were found in the basement, deputies said.

In addition to the whisky, deputies said they found 3,500 gallons of mash.

PRIVATE GROUNDS ARE OPENED BY HOOVERS

Precedent of Thirty Years' Standing Broken for Easter.

WASHINGTON, April 3.—A precedent of thirty years' standing was broken by President and Mrs. Hoover today to welcome the thousands of Easter visitors to Washington.

The President issued an executive order to open the gates of the White House from 12:30 to 1:30 p. m. each day. The gates have been kept closed to the public for thirty years except on special occasions such as the Easter Monday egg rolling festival.

It was indicated at the White House that Mr. and Mrs. Hoover probably would step out on the south portico during the noon hour each day to extend their welcome to the visitors in person.

STOLE CAR TO KEEP DATE: GETS 90 DAYS

'DYE EARLY,' EDICT OF BEAUTY EXPERT

But Watch Your Henna,
She Tells Women of
Nation.

Women's road to perdition has
ceased to be a cigaret, a lipstick and
dye hair.

And when you come to dye—dye early!

These mandates were issued today by America's queen of a land which she dubs "Beautyland," Miss Florence E. Wall of New York, editor of the Chemist.

Miss Wall is "The Authority" on hair dyes, cosmetics and beauty culture.

Others may know how to turn a bulldog mouth into a cupid's bow with a lipstick, but Miss Wall knows the "why" of it.

Attending the annual meeting of the American Chemist Society in this city, Miss Wall took time out to debunk some old superstitions about hair dyes and hair marcel.

"The superstition of women that hair dyes will soften the brain is foolish. Dyes have nothing to do with the brain. They change only that which they touch," she said.

She gave henna dye a spank with the comment, "They say it is not dye and that because of its vegetable origin it is good for the scalp. Neither of these notions is correct."

"Henna is a dye—an orange-red dye—why then should beauty operators act mysteriously about it and deceive patrons. Henna can be used on very few persons because red hair goes naturally with fair complexion," she said.

"Until hairdressers have sufficient strength of mind to stand up and tell a patron that she will look like Old Nick's wife if she persists in

having her hair dyed with henna, we shall continue to see freaks with a shallow complexion, coal black eyebrows, brown eyes and hair that shows a variety of weird shades from eggplant purple to carrot red," she said.

Synthetic organic dyes with the peroxide developer is woman's other choice in dyes, she says.

"The use of cosmetics is no longer a moral question, but is a restoration of the permanent."

She avers the three rules for good permanent waves are: The state of the hair at the time the wave is given; the skill of the operator on the machine chosen, and the care of the hair by the woman following the permanent.

Miss Wall began work as a chemist during the war. She was assistant to Dr. Von Sochocky of the United States Radium Corporation.

Reed, a prominent screen director, had been living in the house with Ivan St. John, a friend.

"Mr. St. John came in, also in a

state of undress. Later, another man entered and tried to appear nonchalant."

R. D. Knickerbocker, Reed's attorney, inquired on cross-examination if the "other man" "fit the brand of cigaret prescribed for embarrassing moments."
