

## GANGS' DAY IN CHICAGO GONE, SAYS CERMAK

Police Department to Be Reorganized, Promises New Mayor.

This second in a series of articles on Anton J. Cermak, mayor-elect of Chicago.

CHICAGO, April 8.—Sweepstake office by the biggest majority ever given a candidate for mayor, Anton J. Cermak today said an incessant hammering for results in the war against crime and in the fields of financing and education will be the keynote of his regime.

At his political headquarters in the Hotel Sherman, while still thumbing hundreds of congratulatory messages on his defeat of Big Bill Thompson, Cermak served notice on the underworld that its days of political power are ending.

All Gunmen Must Go

"What about Al Capone?" Cermak was asked.

"I'm not going to mention gangsters by name. They will all look alike to an efficient police chief and all of them must go," Cermak replied.

"You plan to reorganize the police department?"

"Yes. But I'm not going to be in any hurry about appointing a new chief. I am going to call in the best minds, business men as well as scientific men, before deciding."

"Will the new chief be a civilian, some one like Colonel A. A. Sprague, for instance?"

"That will be decided by the best minds. Whether civilian or from the department ranks, he must be an outstanding man."

No "Burlesque" in Future

Cermak was asked, "how can the gangsters be driven out?"

"By making it unprofitable for them to stay," the new mayor answered. "This is a police problem and must be handled by that department. The gangster can not exist without protection. We will take that away from him."

The mayor-elect made it plain that none of the circus tactics of the Thompson administration would be carried over into his regime.

"No burlesque from here on," he said.

President H. H. Jones said the park board has been asked to remove a number of shacks and weed patches near the tomb. Co-operation of other civic leagues in the work is to be sought.


Old Case Dismissed



Here's problem No. 1 in good old finger, official game of The Times marble tournament.



In the above picture are five marbles, numbered from one to five. At what point around the ring should a player knuckle down and shoot? Study it a moment and then see the picture below.



There are four good spots—one just as good as any other—at which a mib player should knuckle down to take advantage of the position of the marbles.

These points are designated by arrows.

At any other point on the circle, the player has a chance to get one or two marbles.

At the points shown, however, the player has a chance to make any one—or more—of the five mibs. His aim should be made at marble No. 3. If the shooter misses No. 3 by only an inch or so, he's pretty sure to hit one of the other four. Practice the shot for a while.

## SANDINO SENDS NATIONS PLEA FOR NICARAGUA

Asks Aid of All American Countries in 'Fight for Liberty.'

MEXICO CITY, April 9.—An appeal for American nations to unite on Pan-American day, April 14, and lay the foundations "for a policy of continental fraternity and termination of flagrant violation of the rights of the people," was issued today by Augustino Sandino, Nicaraguan insurrection leader, through his Mexico agent, Dr. Pedro Zepeda. One message follows:

"As a Nicaraguan, I am distressed by the Managua earthquake."

"Never in history has a country or people suffered from so much injustice by man, and by fate."

"Presence of the United States military forces in Nicaragua is unworthy of our countrymen, who have trafficked in national honor with their 'protectors' controlling the banks, customs and rail-

roads and systematically assassinating worthy men."

"We do not accept such a state of affairs and the organized calumny that presents us as vulgar bandits, when the official elements of the

United States know that we are fighting for the liberty of our people and the recovery of our autonomy."

"We are issuing a call to the peoples of America that they return to us this part of our great

fatherland. We ask that they unite on April 14—empty called Pan-American day—to lay the foundations for a policy of continental fraternity and to cease the flagrant violations of the rights of man."
