Much evil may be traced to our disregard for the effect our actions have upon others.

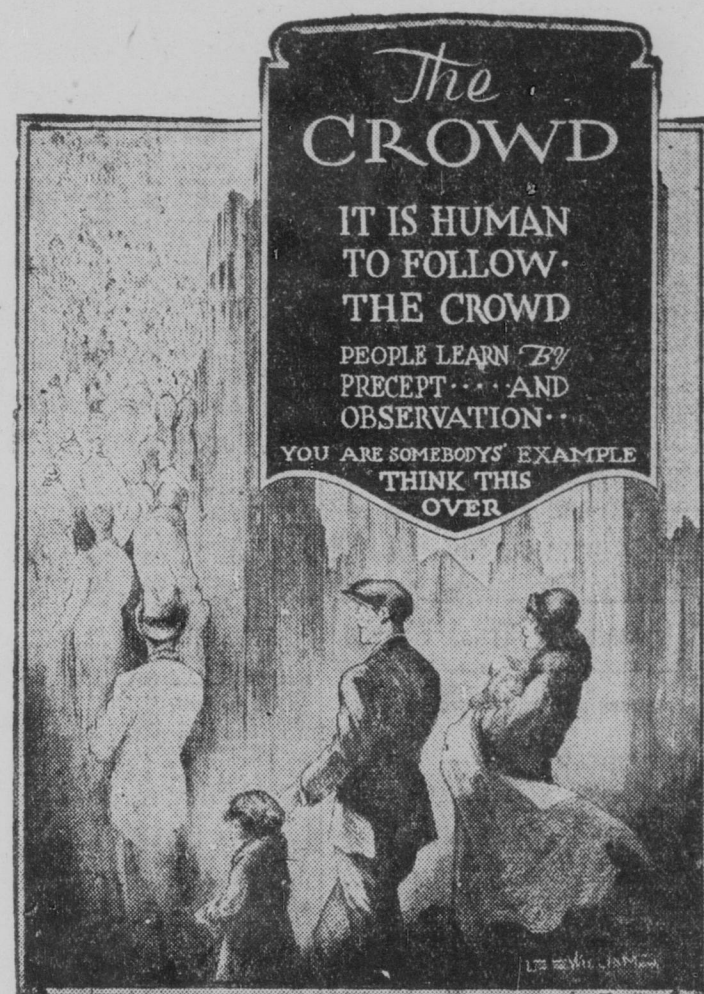
We believe that we see our ideals exemplified by some person.
