

## AIRLINE ADOPTS GROUND 'BLOCK' SIGNAL SYSTEM

Red 'Flagging' Posts Every  
25 Miles to Warn Pilot  
of Hazards.

WASHINGTON, May 8. — The  
Ludington line, busiest air line  
in the world, today adopted the block  
signal system of the railroads for  
controlling its traffic between New  
York and Washington.

There will be five "blocks," one  
every forty miles, along the 200-  
mile airway. No plane will be per-  
mitted to fly past a red signal light.  
Later the blocks will be reduced to  
twenty miles each, with the in-  
stallation of signal lights at emer-  
gency landing fields, according to  
Paul F. Collins, vice-president in  
charge of operations.

With thirty planes flying north  
and south daily, the Ludington line  
found it necessary to devise a sub-  
stitute for the "flagging" system  
formerly used to stop ships.

The line plans to remove the  
radio equipment from its planes,  
relying entirely on the block system  
for control of traffic. While radio  
is extremely valuable on most air-  
lines, it has not been found feasible  
for this short and heavily traveled  
route.

In the future the movement of  
every plane will be controlled by  
Henry Brown, assistant operations  
manager, from his office at Wash-  
ington-Hoover airport.

receive weather reports from the  
pilots as each plane lands at one of  
the fields. These will be co-ordi-  
nated with the government's  
weather reports, and Brown will  
know every minute exactly what  
the weather is all along the 200-  
mile airway.

He will control all the signal  
blocks from his office, and can stop  
any plane along the route by set-  
ting a red light against it.
