

STATE BANKERS TO WEIGH TRADE SLUMP CAUSES

Business Outlook Among Topics on Two-Day Program Here.

Indiana bankers will take a collective view of the business depression and scan horizons of the future when they attend the thirty-fifth annual convention of the Indiana Bankers Association at the Claypool Wednesday and Thursday, the convention's program indicated today.

Bank legislation also will come in for discussion at one session, while review of foreign banking and consideration of general banking problems also are on the program.

A roof garden party at the Indianapolis Athletic Club at 7 Wednesday night will provide entertainment for the first day of the meeting, while Thursday night the bankers will gather for a banquet in the Claypool.

Wednesday morning's program will be featured by an address by C. F. Schwenker, Wisconsin banking commissioner, on "The Banker—1932 Model," and in the afternoon Edward J. Kelly of New York will speak on "Trust Investment Supervision," and Justin H. Moore, New York, on "The Business Outlook."

CITY PLANS TO BUILD 3 NEW FIRE STATIONS

\$60,000 Ordinance Will Be Laid Before Council Next Week.

Ordinance authorizing a \$60,000 bond issue for construction of three new fire stations is being prepared by the city legal department for introduction at the city council session June 15, it was announced today.

Decision to go ahead with plans for building the new stations this summer was reached at a conference of safety board members, council finance committee, City Controller William L. Elder and City Attorney James E. Deery, with Mayor Reginald H. Sullivan Monday.

The three new fire stations will not require any new apparatus or new

firemen, as they will replace three old stations.

One station will be constructed on the site of old Station 19 at Morris and Harding, which was abandoned several weeks ago as too dangerous for occupancy. Temporary quarters nearby have been obtained.

Another station would be located near Forty-sixth and Illinois streets, in the Butler university district, which now is without adequate fire protection, according to Charles R. Myers, safety board president.

The third would be in the vicinity of Central avenue and Eleventh street.

The two stations to be abandoned

would be Station 8, at St. Clair street and Massachusetts avenue, and Station 16, Sixteenth street and Ashland avenue. The latter station would be used as a storage house for the Gamewell department.

Both stations are poorly located and have outlived their usefulness, Myers said. Station 16 is only eight blocks south of another station at Twenty-fourth street and Ashland avenue.
