

WARNS BROWN BLACKTOP USE AT OWN RISK

Attorney Withdraws Petition for Restraining Order on Material.

Warning John J. Brown, state highway director, that paving of state roads with blacktop will be "at his own risk," Fred C. Gause, attorney, today withdrew a petition for a circuit court restraining order against use of the material.

Gause, representing Robert E. O'Connor of Ft. Wayne, who is suing the commission charging that no other road material bids are accepted on the project in question but those on blacktop, said the suit for an injunction will remain on file for trial this fall.

O'Connor specifically seeks to prevent the commission from carrying out the improvement of State road 9, from Columbia City to Huntington.

Awarding of road contracts for blacktop has brought criticism from contractors throughout the state who claim they are being excluded from bidding.

Recently, Governor Harry G. Leslie asserted competitive bids would be received by the commission on all roads, and that those on which bids were submitted two weeks ago would be blocked until all road material types were represented.

However, it is reported that Leslie since has retreated from this stand. Residents of Jefferson county today won their first step in the county courts in a five-year fight proposed on rerouting of State Road

SUITS AFTER ROBBERY

Re-Issue of Bank Stock Presumed Stolen Sought in Action.

NOBLESVILLE, Ind., July 2.—A sequel to the robbery of the Jolietville State bank in western Hamilton county in January when three bandits escaped with \$1,400 is brought out in two friendly suits filed against the bank in Hamilton circuit court here by Albert Gardner personally and as administrator of the estate of Cora Gardner. The latter had a certificate for \$1,100 in bank stock on deposit at the time of the robbery and Gardner had a similar certificate for \$200.

Both certificates have been missing since the robbery and it is presumed that they were stolen by the bandits and destroyed. The court is asked for an order requiring the bank to reissue stock certificates to replace the ones missing.
