

'NEVER ARGUE WITH WOMEN,' JUDGE ADVISES

Even Have First Rights on Parking Spaces, City Youth Learns.

Motorists, a woman not only may have the last word in domestic debate, but when she sets her heart on one of the precious downtown parking spaces she may, too, end up with the last fender—as be cautious. Take, as your warning, this episode from municipal court three today, where Carl Pollard, 19, of 1035 River avenue, and Mrs. Mary E. Simms, 32, of 1812 North Pennsylvania street, glared at each other before Judge Pro-Tem Paul Rochford.

Simultaneously they spied a parking space near Meridian and Washington streets late Monday. Fenders nudged, fenders bent, and finally fenders crumpled and crashed as they battled for the prized place. Traffic congested more than a block from the "crossroads of America," and then Traffic Police-man Carl Ahley went into action, writing Pollard's ticket for reckless driving, and Mrs. Simms' for improper parking and failure to have her driver's license.

"Young man," Judge Rochford addressed Pollard today, "you can't get the best of an argument with a woman. I'll suspend your fine, but as a lesson in politeness, your driver's license is suspended ninety days."

It was Mrs. Simms' turn to smile—and then to frown, too.

"You have your driver's license with you today, so I'll withhold judgment on that charge," the judge told her. "I'll suspend the fine on the improper parking charge, too, but you should have much the same treatment as this young man. Your license is suspended thirty days."

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'LIKE A DREAM,' SAYS POST OF WORLD FLIGHT

Wiley Overcomes Shyness, Tells All About Record Trip.

WASHINGTON, July 7.—Acclaim in Washington for his record-breaking flight around the world led Wiley Post to break another record—he overcame his bashfulness about public speaking.

This accomplishment came only after Senator Hiram Bingham piled him with many questions at a banquet in honor of Post and his navigator, Harold Gatty.

At first Post answered the queries with as brief replies as possible, interspersed with many "wells" and "ahs." Finally in low voice he launched into a detailed account that included every landing and take-off.

"I don't know what it's all about," Post concluded. "It seems like a dream."

The Russians were very hospitable, he said. So generous, in fact, that they delayed the fliers twice. At Moscow the fliers had to wait several hours to attend a banquet. At the next stop attendants at the flying field insisted on filling up the plane's gas tanks, although Post had ordered only a small quantity because the field was very rough.

"They put in about 450 gallons, and we couldn't take off at all. It took us about three hours to get the gas out of the plane."
