

## SUIT INVOLVES RULE OF PARK, ZONING BOARDS

Judge Weir Studies Briefs  
on Plea for Retrial of  
Jurisdiction Case.

Briefs requesting a new trial on one of the most important cases in which the city zoning board ever has been involved, were being studied today by Superior Judge Clarence E. Weir.

Ruling of Judge Weir has aroused a neighborhood fight over erection of a filling station at the southwest corner of Delaware street and Fall Creek boulevard.

Albert Stump, attorney for the zoning board, declared at a hearing on motion for a new trial Tuesday that the ruling had tied hands of that board.

**Jurisdiction Is Basis**  
Jurisdiction of the zoning and park boards in granting building permits, is basis of the ruling. Judge Weir recently held that when jurisdiction of the two boards conflicts, the zoning board jurisdiction prevails.

He held the zoning board should issue a permit to Mrs. Mary Stanford allowing her to erect a filling station.

Summer A. Clancy, attorney for property owners, opposing the erection, Stump and Nathan Swaim, park board attorneys, demanded the new trial.

**Suit Now Pending**  
A suit to mandate the zoning board to issue the permit in accordance with Judge Weir's ruling now is pending in superior court one.

Mrs. Stanford's attorneys argued her property was not suitable for erecting of a dwelling house or apartment building, as set out and requested in the park board ordinance.

Stump argued Judge Weir had no right "to go into the unreasonableness of the zoning act."

Clancy demanded that his clients, who had filed an intervening petition opposing the permit to Mrs. Stanford be made parties in the case. Judge Weir told them he would rule on the new trial motion after studying the briefs.

### CITE COP FOR VALOR

Morton to Get Medal for Bravery in

The safety board today agreed to allow Northwest Police Journal to award a medal of valor to Harold Morton, motorcycle policeman, who captured an alleged rum runner after a gun battle with the boot-legged and an accomplice last week.

Police Chief Mike Morrissey said he would recommend similar recognition of the bravery of Detective Sergeant Charles Bauer, who was wounded in a battle with the slayers of Lafayette A. Jackson, grocery magnate, last summer.

The board suspended James J. Hayes, patrolman, for conduct unbecoming an officer.

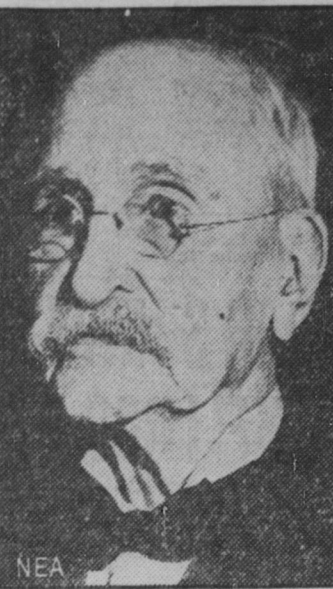

Contract for widening and paving of Sixteenth street, from Capitol avenue west to Northwestern avenue, will not be let until several names on petitions have been checked.

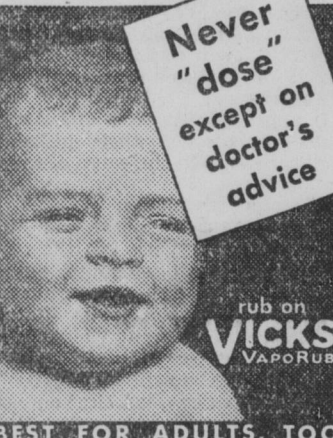
Other contracts let to the Mead Construction Company were:

## GIGANTIC AKRON IS POISED FOR MAIDEN FLIGHT

World's Largest Airship to  
Take to Skies Today in  
First Jaunt.

AKRON, O., Sept. 23.—Calm weather, desired for the maiden voyage of the gigantic dirigible Akron, prevailed here today as navy airmen made last-minute preparations to take the Zeppelin on its trip aloft.

The initial flight, postponed on Monday because of unfavorable conditions, was to follow a triangular course. A crew of forty-four enlisted men and twelve officers, commanded by Lieutenant Commander Charles E. Rosendahl, was to man the huge airship.

The fair weather was expected to prevail at 3 p. m., the hour set for the start.

The Akron, with its eight motors developing a total horse power nearly twice that of the Graf Zeppelin, was to cruise for two hours before returning to the airdock here.

On the first trial flight, the ship was expected to cover about 100 miles. It has a cruising speed of fifty miles an hour, and a maximum speed of 33.8 miles an hour.

After the maiden voyage, the 785-foot ship will be hangared and inspected for the series of test flights to be made within the next few weeks.

The Akron, which has a diameter of 122 feet and a volume of 6,500,000 cubic feet, is the largest airship in the world.
