

## SOUTH BEND IN 'HOT SPOT' IS INSIDE STORY

Graft Leading to Murder Threats, Is Tale Told to Democrats.

Baring the inside angles of the war between South Bend city officials which was precipitated when a gambling club was raided "in error," Mayor William P. Krau of Elkhart today declared that a prominent Republican attorney there was threatened with the "spot" because he could not return the \$20,000 pay-off.

Krau lifted the lid on the affair while here for the Democratic state committee meeting today.

He declared that the same gang which was responsible for the South Bend rumpus had attempted to buy its way into Elkhart, but had been refused by him.

### Indictments Are Certain

"The whole scandal up at South Bend with the mayor (W. R. Hinckle) demanding that the city controller (Rudy Ackerman) resign while the latter, backed by the city council urging that the mayor be impeached, has gone so far," declared Krau, "there are bound to be indictments."

"When the Chicago gamblers came to Elkhart and tried to open up we told them nothing doing."

"Later I heard that they got into South Bend after paying out \$20,000 for noninterference. They laid out the money to a prominent Republican attorney there I learned from reliable sources."

"Then came the raid through a mistake by the police and the gamblers descended upon the attorney to get their money back."

### Money Split Five Ways

"One of the sharpshooters put his gun against the attorney's ribs and demanded that he refund the \$20,000."

"This money was split five ways. I haven't got it and I don't know how to get it back. Of course you can put me on the spot and kill me, but you will never get your money back that way," the lawyer told them," Krau related.

The gamblers saw the reason of this argument and recognized that they would never get a refund after a five-way split.

"But the blow-off is a cinch to come," Krau said. "It has been brewing for a long time."


