

REPRIEVE AGAIN SAVES SLAYER

'Squealer' Bell Is Granted
30-Day Stay.

CHICAGO, Nov. 27.—Frank (The
Squealer) Bell, condemned to death
in the electric chair at one minute
past midnight, today had a thirty-
day reprieve through intercession of

a United States government official.
Bell, convicted of the murder of a
restaurant proprietor, was saved two
hours before the scheduled execution
by action of Governor Louis
L. Emmerson.

Emmerson, who previously had
refused a stay, acted after a plea
by Murray W. Garson, special as-
sistant secretary of labor assigned to
Chicago for a roundup of deportable
aliens. Garson said his influence
was exerted in a private rather than
an official capacity.

It was Bell's second last minute
escape from death. He was to have
died in the electric chair Oct. 16,
but thirty-five minutes before the
electrocution was planned his at-

torneys obtained a writ for an in-
sanity hearing.

The reason for Emmerson's re-
prieve after he previously had an-
nounced he would not intervene in
the case was not known definitely.

It was believed by prison officials,
however, that Garson hoped to ob-
tain valuable information for his
deportation drive from Bell. It was
thought probably Bell's aid is de-
sired in rounding up members of the
Capone gang, with which he
asserted was connected.

That the plea for the condemned
man's life was powerful was shown
by the failure of earlier appeals by
prison officials and prominent Chi-
cagoans on the grounds that Bell
