

SUIT TO DEFER DEBT PAYMENT LOST IN COURT

Judge Orders Bond Issue
for \$50,000 School
Deficit.

Court battle of Warren township taxpayers to defer payment of a \$50,000 school debt, alleged to have been incurred illegally by an ex-trustee, was defeated today on a 8-cent hike in township taxes.

The debt, which accumulated from school repair expenses during the two-year administration of William H. Cooper, former trustee, aroused a storm of protest among taxpayers and threatened to force an 8-cent hike in township taxes.

Williams ordered the township to issue \$50,000 bonds to pay William W. Behrman and two other persons who hold school warrant bonds for the deficit.

Township officials planned to pay off the debt by raising taxes over a period of several years instead of paying the debt from one year's assessments. Under Williams' ruling, the warrant bonds will be purchased from the holders by the township.

The debt, nearly half of which was saddled on the township by installation of plumbing in virtually a new school, forced officials to reduce the school term last year from nine to eight months. This drew criticism of parents, who feared the school's rating would be lowered.

A state board of accounts probe disclosed Cooper paid excessive prices for the plumbing, and resulted in Cooper's making resti-

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tion for funds alleged to have been used wrongfully.

Subsequently, suit was filed against Cooper in Marion county court asking \$600 judgment for alleged misappropriation of funds in hiring of an unqualified teacher at the school.

Another suit was filed seeking to force Cooper to refund nearly \$13,000 of the money spent while he was in office. Neither suit has been decided.

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NAB GUARDSMEN IN RUM PLOT

30 Under Arrest; Million in
Bribes Charged.

NEW YORK, Jan. 8.—Thirty coast guardsmen are under arrest and a commander and members of his staff are reported under investigation on charges of accepting

bribes totaling more than \$1,000,000 from a gigantic Long Island rum ring, it was learned on good authority today.

Several of the coast guardsmen have confessed to accepting bribes to permit liquor cargoes to be landed, it was also learned. They reportedly have implicated commissioned officers and "higher ups," who, they alleged, were paid huge sums to "keep their eyes shut."

The investigation is centered, it was said, in the district assertedly overlorded by Vannie Higgins, racketeer chief.

Higgins is scheduled to go on trial next Tuesday in Brooklyn federal court with fifteen others.
