

**SCOUT TROOPS
ARE PLANNING
CITY CONTESTS**

District Rally Winners to Enter Championship Meet Feb. 13.

Boy Scouts in all Indianapolis district troops are making final arrangements for participation in district rallies to begin tonight.

Riverside and Roosevelt districts will start the contests which will lead to the council-wide championship rally in Tomlinson hall Feb. 13.

First place winners in each district rally will form the entries in the championship contest.

First of the series of contests in knot tying, fire by friction, fire by flint and steel, signaling by semaphore and candle relay will be supervised by L. E. Allen, deputy commissioner, Friday night at 8, in Riverside Methodist Episcopal church, Edgemont and Harding streets.

Plan Contests Friday

Riverside district, to meet at the home of troop No. 77, is comprised of troops Nos. 70, 71 and 77. Troop committeemen and city scouting leaders will be judges.

Roosevelt district, of six troops, also will stage contests Friday night at Brightwood M. E. church, 2414 Station street, under the direction of Kenneth Hittle, deputy commissioner.

Troops to take part in the events are: Troops Nos. 25, 73, 87, 88, 95 and 97. Other district rallies will be held by the following districts:

Pioneer, west half, at Grace M. E. church, New York street and Grand avenue, Wednesday night with troops Nos. 1, 27, 28, 47, 48 and 49, under supervision of W. A. Sanford, who will direct the district rally; east half, at Downey Avenue Christian church, Downey and Julian avenues, Jan. 29. East half Pioneer troops include Nos. 3, 9, 10, 19, 91, 52 and 93.

Others Plan Rallies

Central district, Negro troops Nos. 5, 11, 31, 32, 43, 63 and 85 will stage a rally in school No. 26, Sixteenth street and Columbia avenue, the night of Jan. 22, with M. Hanns, Berry directing the contests.

Garfield district rally, Jan. 23, in Garfield park community house, will be conducted by Lloyd Byrne. Eight troops will be entered.

Three districts, Rainbow-Harrison, the south half of North Star and Yankee district, will hold rallies Jan. 29. North half of North Star district will meet at the Butler gym Jan. 30. This includes all troops north of Thirty-eighth street. Dixie and Washington districts also will compete Saturday, Jan. 30.
