

## SHUN SHANGHAI FOREIGN COLONY JAPAN WARNED

American Consul Acts to Quell Row as Nippon Rattles Sword.

SHANGHAI Jan. 22.—Japanese must stay out of the international settlement to avoid further disturbances here, American Consul General Edwin Cunningham warned today.

After a conference of foreign consular officials and settlement authorities, Cunningham said:

"The Japanese must stay out of the settlement. If they stay out, there won't be any trouble."

The conference was called to consider the tense situation caused by the receipt of Tokio dispatches saying that twenty-two additional Japanese warships were being loaded at Sasebo naval base for emergency orders. Presumably to proceed to Shanghai.

### Dispatches Ultimatum

Other reports from Tokio said that the Japanese were prepared to send troops to reinforce landing parties if necessary.

Six Japanese warships were expected here late Saturday, in addition to the four already in port. It was understood that British and American naval officers had conferred informally regarding the situation.

General Wu Te-Chen, mayor of greater Shanghai, prepared to transmit to Nanking the ultimatum issued by Rear Admiral Koichi Shiosawa, commander of the Japanese naval forces off the Chinese coast, in which he said the fleet was "ready to act drastically to protect Japanese rights and interests in the event that the Shanghai municipal council, the Chinese bureau of public safety, and the mayor of greater Shanghai fail to comply with Japanese demands for satisfactory reparations in connection with recent disturbances."

### Chinese Ask Troops

Two Chinese and one Japanese were killed and a Japanese mob burned two Chinese factories in the disturbances referred to.

The belief increased that the Japanese intended to stage an impressive display of naval and military strength to influence the Chinese to abandon the boycott of Japanese goods.

Police prepared extra precautions for Saturday afternoon, when the Japanese killed in the recent riots will be buried. Japanese mass meetings are planned after the funeral service.

Chinese residents of the Shanghai area petitioned the Nanking government to dispatch troops here.

### Uncertain on Arms Cut

NAPLES, Jan. 22.—The situation in the far east makes impossible a definite prediction of Japan's attitude at the Geneva disarmament conference, and the Japanese position will depend upon that of other world powers, leaders of the Japanese delegation said here today.

The delegation, totaling forty members, arrived aboard the steamer Suva Maru en route to Paris, where a preliminary meeting will be held prior to the conference.

General Matsui and Admiral Nagayo were spokesmen. General Matsui said "we strongly support the idea of lasting peace among the peoples of the world, especially at the present moment of world crisis. Change of heart is required."
