

## NEW LOUISIANA GOVERNOR SETS GUARD AT DOOR

'There Should Be a Few Funerals in This State,' Says Foe.

BATON ROUGE, Jan. 25.—Louisiana's second "battle of the Governors" was on today, with phrase makers displacing munitions makers, and one "Governor" decimating himself in favor of "a few funerals in this state."

The Macabre gubernatorial platform plank was handed down by Paul Cyr, dentist-claimant to the office vacated by Huey P. Long, when he crossed the state line en route to Washington to be sworn in as United States senator from Louisiana.

And it was in response to action of Alvin O. King, entrenched in the statehouse at Baton Rouge, with ten sturdy officers of the highway patrol defending the statehouse and executive mansion "for the people, for the Governor and for Louisiana," as he put it.

The guard was ordered by King to defend his right to sit as Governor and to repel any effort of Cyr to usurp the office.

Dr. Cyr's comment on King's action came in what he called a mandate to "my loyal subjects." Of the guards and the forces they represented, Cyr said:

"I'll take care of them or else they'll take care of me. Personally, I think a few funerals in this state would help a lot. I just hope the right persons are in those funerals. I think the people of Louisiana feel the same way."

To all of which "Governor" King's comment could be applied:

"As a boy in Kansas I used to run down jackrabbits with a stick. If any one attempts to take the rights of Governor from me, I'll treat them just as bad as I did the jackrabbits. And very few of them ever got away from me."

### TURKEY ONLY CASUALTY WHEN AUTOS COLLIDE

Meets Death Ahead of Schedule; Driver Held in Crash.

A turkey, en route to slaughter, met death ahead of schedule Sunday when it was the victim of an automobile accident at Senate avenue and Ohio street.

Ben Small, 311 West Twenty-fifth street, was taking the turkey to the executioner's block for his employer. At the intersection his car collided with another driven by B. R. Turner, 56, of 942 North Keystone avenue.

After Small's and Turner's cars overturned, the turkey was found dead under a utility pole.

C. H. Shaw, 80, of the Keystone avenue address, riding with Turner, incurred slight shoulder injuries. Small was charged with speeding and reckless driving.

### POLICE HOLD BROTHERS AS ROBBERY SUSPECTS

Accuse Bloomington Men in Slugging of Motorist.

Suspected as two of a trio who slugged an robbed John Thomas Curry of Franklin, near Southport several weeks ago, Homer and Gilbert Sipes, Bloomington, were arrested early today on charges of auto banditry, robbery, vehicle taking and vagrancy.

Charles Noll, Indianapolis, third suspect, was arrested shortly after the alleged robbery and was bound over to the grand jury on similar charges.

Curry is said to have picked up the trio as he drove home from Indianapolis late at night. He was slugged, robbed, and his automobile was stolen. Later the car was overturned and burned in a ditch near the robbery scene.

### HELD IN LOTTERY CASE

E. E. White Jr. Arrested After Alleged Winner Complains.

Holding E. E. White Jr., 64½ Brookville road, as the alleged state agent for a lottery, authorities today probed affairs of the Canadian Sweepstakes Association and "Royal Poker Ticket" lotteries.

White was arrested Sunday by Lieutenant Ed Kruse, who said White admitted his connections with the lotteries. Hundreds of tickets were confiscated from White, police said.

According to officers, White was nabbed after a woman complained of not being paid for a winning ticket in one of the alleged gambles. White is charged with operating a lottery scheme and gift enterprise.

### TEST TUBE SLIP FATAL

Young Physician Gets Cyanide in Mouth in Laboratory.

BOSTON, Jan. 25.—A laboratory accident has removed from the world of science a brilliant young physician, whose research was considered as among the most promising in the battle against cancer.

A chemist found definitely that Dr. Eugene Chellis Glover, 29, died at city hospital Friday from a bit of cyanide that reached his mouth during an experiment. Medical Examiner Timothy Leary thinks the doctor probably drew too much of a cyanide solution into calibrated tube while performing a blood sugar test.
