

HOOVER ANGRERS SENATE IN LIST OF NOMINATIONS

Long Opens Career With
Attack on 'Backyard
Appointments.'

WASHINGTON, Jan. 28.—Head-
ed by such names as Charles G.
Dawes, Harvey Couch and Jesse
H. Jones, President Hoover's nomi-
nations today faced heavy bom-
bardment from progressive Demo-
crats and Republicans in the sen-
ate.

Veteran members could not re-
member when so many presiden-
tial appointments had caused so
much dissatisfaction among vari-
ous elements.
Making his maiden speech only
three days after he reached the
capital, Senator Huey Long (Dem.,
La.) served notice that he was
"tired of seeing the President
reaching into backyards for nomi-
nees."

He announced he would oppose
numerous members of the tariff,
power and federal trade commis-
sions when their present terms ex-
pire and their names are sent up
again.

Dawes, Couch and Jones, three
of the four directors of the re-
construction corporation, were ap-
proved by the banking and cur-
rency committee with no dissent,
except from Senator Blaine (Rep.,
Wis.). The latter's demand for an
investigation and hearing was
smothered, but the senator held up
senate action. He refused to con-
sent to immediate consideration,
forcing the nominations to lay
over for a day.

of Arkansas, marshalling the con-
servative Democrats, and regular
Republicans lining up behind Hoo-
ver, it is expected they will be con-
firmed easily. About a dozen pro-
gressives may register protest in
their vote or in a short speech ex-
plaining their action.

There is almost no opposition to
Dawes, but there is some objection
to Couch, public utility magnate,
and to Jones, a Texas publisher
with real estate and building inter-
ests. Both are southern Democrats,
however, although Representative
Edgar Howard (Dem., Neb.) has
raised the question of whether
Couch actually belongs to that
party.

Besides these men, others under
fire are Judge James H. Wilkerson,
of Illinois, and Kenneth Mackin-
tosh of Washington, who have been
named to the federal circuit court.
Colonel Thad Brown of Ohio who
has been appointed to the federal
radio commission, will be fought by
Senator James Couzens (Rep.,
Mich.).

Labor has turned thumbs down
on the two judicial nominees on the
ground that they have been unfair
to organized labor. Couzens charges
that Brown's main qualifications
are his political activities in Ohio
on behalf of Hoover. Brown ran
the President's 1928 primary con-
vention in that state.

William E. Humphreys was con-
firmed for the federal trade com-
mission late Wednesday after a
sharp attack against him.
