

BULK OF PAVING JOBS GIVEN TO INDIANA FIRMS

Contracts for 92 Miles to Cost More Than Million Are Awarded.

Governor Harry G. Leslie's policy of awarding state highway contracts to Indiana bidders was adhered to only partially by the state highway commissions in announcing the award on ninety-two miles of paving at a cost in excess of \$1,000,000. The McCarthy Improvement Company, Davenport, Ia., was turned down on two projects upon which they submitted the low bid and awards were made instead to the Indiana Road Paving Company, Rochester, and Foulkes Contracting Company Terre Haute. Difference between the awards and low bid totaled \$2,370.97.

But all the work did not go to the Hoosier concerns. Two contracts went to Kentucky. The list follows: State road No. 30, nineteen-hundredth mile of pavement widening at Dyer, in LaMoine county; Gross Construction Company of La Porte \$3,709.56. State road No. 6, from road No. 13 to Ligonier, thirteen and one-tenth miles in Elbert and Noble counties; Mosier Construction Company of Ft. Wayne, \$11,824.12. State road No. 36, from road No. 43 to Greveland eight and five-tenths miles in Putnam county; F. B. Putnam of Fort Wayne, \$110,323.47. State road No. 36, from Montezuma to Rockville, eight and two-tenths miles in Parke and Vermilion counties; F. B. Putnam of Ft. Wayne, \$112,256.62. State road No. 39, from two and five-tenths miles northeast of Middlebury to Michigan line two and eight-tenths miles

State road No. 47, from the Parke county line to a point three and five-tenths miles northeast of Brown's Valley, nine and six-tenths miles in Montgomery county; Indiana Road Paving Company of Rochester, \$164,036.01.

State road No. 46, from the Vigo county line to road No. 56, six and eight-tenths miles in Clay county; Foulkes Contracting Company of Terre Haute, \$125,222.88. State road No. 20, Versailles to Madison, twenty-three miles in Ripley and Jefferson counties; Blair & Franks, Connersville, \$127,725.93. This project is for bituminous treated pavement. All others are for concrete, with cement furnished by the state.

FRANK GAGEBY, PIONEER STATE ENGINEER, DIES

Funeral Rites to Be Held Friday; Opened Greene County Coal Field.

Frank A. Gageby, 68, 612 North Beville avenue, one of the pioneer engineers engaged in opening the Greene county coal fields, died Wednesday night in Methodist hospital, following several weeks of illness.

The Rev. George S. Henninger will officiate at funeral services at 1 Friday at the Johnson & Montgomery funeral home, 1622 North Meridian street. Burial will be in Washington Park cemetery.

Mr. Gageby, for the last ten years, has been field engineer for the highway commission. He served as supervisor of construction in central Indiana.

He was a member of the East Tenth Street Methodist Episcopal church, Delta Tau Delta fraternity, Continental Masonic lodge No. 541 at Brazil; the Scottish Rite and Murat Shrine. He was a resident of Linton for twenty-five years and served as surveyor of Greene county during one term.

Services for Mrs. Rose B. Dobson, 54, resident of this city all her life, will be held at 3:30 Friday at the J. Blackwell & Sons undertaking establishment, 926 North Capitol

avenue, with burial in Holy Cross cemetery.

Mrs. Dobson died Wednesday at her home, 62 South Bradley avenue, after an illness of four weeks. She attended St. John's school and Indianapolis public high schools. Thirty-six years ago she was married to Thomas J. Dobson.

She was a member of Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic church and of the Ladies' Aid Society of the Pennsylvania railroad.

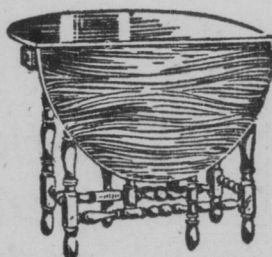
