

CORONATION OF POPE OBSERVED

Brilliant Pageant Marks Tenth Anniversary.

VATICAN CITY, Feb. 12.—The tenth anniversary of the coronation of Pope Pius XI was celebrated today with an imposing ceremony at St. Peter's.

The pope, dressed in his pontifical robes, was carried by special bearers on the "sedia gestatoria," or

throne chair. He wore his tiara, or triple crown. On either side of the pontiff, bearers of the "flosiliae," large ostrich feather fans, waved the fans in a scene suggestive of the court of an eastern potentate. Swiss guards, in their picturesque Renaissance uniforms, and carrying long pikes, led the papal procession, which included the pope's secret chamberlains, the consistorial attorneys, the protonotaries and notaries of the papal court, and a large number of prelates. Bishops, archbishops and cardinals followed all in their colored canopy.

The pope was carried to the throne prepared for him near the pontifical altar. He knelt in prayer before the altar, then ascended to Washington Monday.






