

## OPPOSITION CHIEF SLASH IN AGAINST VALUEY HAULING

Tax unpaved Roads, Made Soft by Rains, in Danger of Serious Damage.

Damage amounting to several thousands of dollars may be inflicted to unpaved roads of Indiana, which are in a softened condition due to cold weather and frequent rains, if heavy loads are hauled, according to a bulletin issued today by John J. Brown, state highway director.

Brown urges co-operation of the motor public, especially truck operators, explaining that lightly loaded trucks will aid materially in reducing the chance of damage and will result in the roads being in better condition for spring use.

Length and surface condition of detours in the state system are described as follows by the bulletin:

Road 4—Detour from 15 miles west of the junction with Road 15 to Nappanee, five miles; good gravel.

Road 5—Detour, two miles; good gravel.

Road 35—Detour, same south of Kokomo.

Road 45—Detour at junction with U. S. Road 52, one and one-half miles; good gravel and pavement.

Road 49—Detour from Chesterfield north.

Road 54—Detour between Hobbsville and Springville, eight miles; between Avoca and Bedford, 10 miles; between narrow stone roads, with several narrow roads.

Road 48—Detour at junction of Roads 45 and 49, take Road 45 to Bloomington, thence Road 37 to Bedford.

Road 60—Detour from Vincennes to Monroe City, sixteen miles (twelve miles over U. S. 50).

Where paving projects were opened recently to traffic, and work is in progress on the berms, careful driving should prevail.

**EARLY VACCINATION IS URGED FOR CHILDREN**

Protection Should Be Given Before First Birthday, Doctor Says.

**BALTIMORE, Feb. 19.**—Children should have their first smallpox vaccination before they reach their first birthdays. Dr. Charles Armstrong of the United States public health service and the National Institute of Health advised students of medicine and public health at the fifth De La Mar lecture of this season at the Johns Hopkins school of hygiene and public health here.

This protects the child from deadly disfiguring smallpox during the first year of his life, when he otherwise would be susceptible to the disease. At this age children suffer less severe reactions after the vaccination than older children, Dr. Armstrong pointed out, and they are less likely to develop the complications which occasionally follow smallpox vaccinations in older children.

Dr. Armstrong described the method of vaccination which his studies of the subject have shown to be best.

"Fixed dressings and shields should be avoided," he declared.
