**MINERS ARE OFFERED
NEW SCALE OF WAGES**

TERRE HAUTE, Ind., April 5.—The Indiana Coal Operators Association today announced a new wage scale and offered work to all miners who would accept employment under its terms.

In a newspaper advertisement outlining the proposed scale, the association offered \$4.49 a day to motormen. Under the recent contract, motormen received \$6.85. In other fields they receive \$4.05, \$3.50 and \$2.70, the association asserted.

The association offered \$3.50 to top men, who formerly received \$5.60. Pumpers, trippers, timbermen, track layers, jerrymen and cagers were offered \$4, compared with former pay of \$6.10.

The price offered for machine-mined coal was 43 cents a ton. Sixty cents a ton was offered for picked coal. The former rates were 75 and 90 cents, respectively.

All union shaft miners in this territory have been idle since the contracts expired.


