

'BACK TO FARM' MOVE HALTED; NAB CHILDREN

Police Hold Three Chicago Youngsters Bound to Dugger.

A "back to the soil" movement of three Chicago children was halted today by police, and as a result the detention home has three more inmates.

The children are Betty Wads, 13; her brother John, 12, and their cousin, Corrine Boder, 14, all of 6401 Stewart street, Chicago.

After Captain Jesse McMurtry had been advised by residents of the 2500 block West Washington street that the children were trying to "thumb" automobile rides, he dispatched an automobile squad to the locality and the children were brought to headquarters.

Betty, attired in overalls, was the spokesman.

"You see, captain, John and I want to go to Dugger, Ind., where our daddy, Orville Woods, lives on a farm with grandpa," she said. "We started from Chicago yesterday morning and hitch-hiked into Indianapolis. We intend to go from here to Terre Haute and then to Dugger."

After the explanation, Betty glanced around.

"Is this a police station?" she asked.

Informed that it was, the girl began crying.

"I don't want to stay in any police stations," she said.

McMurtry sent the children to the detention home, where they will be cared for until Woods is advised.

The children explained they had been living with an aunt in Chicago, but decided they wanted to go back to the farm.

TAX BILL TOTAL IS \$100,000,000 SHORT OF GOAL

Smoot Says New Sources of Revenue Must Be Located.

WASHINGTON, May 5.—The new tax bill in its present form would produce about \$100,000,000 less than estimates of what revenue is needed, it developed today.

Chairman Reed Smoot of the senate finance committee said the committee must seek new sources of revenue before the bill can be presented to the senate.

The bill as it shapes up after the committee's revision would fall some \$300,000,000 short of balancing the budget.

It was estimated originally that

\$200,000,000 of this would be absorbed by governmental economies.

The wrecking of the economy bill, however, raises the possibility that much of this will have to be raised through taxation.

It was indicated that the committee would look again to incomes as a possible means of raising the money.

PRESS FACING BIG WIRE TAX

Levy of Million a Year on Tolls Approved.

WASHINGTON, May 5.—The senate finance committee by action taken late yesterday, made a permanent part of the national tax

plan taxes which will cost the newspapers of the country, according to estimates by experts, a million dollars a year.

These taxes are levied on telephone and telegraph messages, cablegrams and radiograms and on wires used in the transmission of news. The taxes on telephone messages range from 10 to 20 cents per message. On telegrams the tax will be 5 per cent of the tolls. The tax on radiograms and cablegrams is 10 cents for each message. On wires used for news transmission, the tax will be 5 per cent of charges paid.
