

STORM DELAYS AIR HUNT FOR 2 SCIENTISTS

One Plane Forced to Land on Glacier During Search of Mt. McKinley.

FAIRBANKS, Alaska, May 20.—A fierce spring blizzard that blotted out the mountain landscape today halted temporarily the aerial rescue of two scientists, one marooned, the other missing, on the icy slope of Mt. McKinley.

Two of the three Alaskan airways pilots in the relief expedition reported by radio that the storm had forced them to land on Muldrow glacier, where two members of the group studying the cosmic ray met death.

The planes are hunting Nicholas Spadeveckia, New York scientist, missing more than a week in the desolate area, and Percy T. Olson Jr., who remained on the mountain side to direct relief efforts.

Pilot S. E. Robbins, a veteran of the Arctic, reported by radio, three hours after he had been expected back here, that the storm had forced him to land on the glacier before he had been able to reach Olson's base camp.

A few hours previously, Joe Crosson, chief pilot of the airways, radioed here that he had abandoned the hunt for Spadeveckia temporarily until weather conditions improved.

Pilot Jerry Jones, en route here after flying the mail to Nome, hoped to join his companions in a flight over the mountain area today. Jones had succeeded previously in rescuing E. P. Beckwith, a member of the party, who had become ill.

Spadeveckia has been missing since he set out over the treacherous fields to bring relief for Beckwith.
