

FINE FOUR FOR CLOSING HOMES TO ILL MOTHER

Order Three to Contribute to Support of Parent Now in Infirmary.

Four children who permitted their aged, paralyzed mother to lie in an ambulance two hours Wednesday, all refusing to give her haven in their homes, were fined today in municipal court three, and all but one ordered to contribute to support of their parent.

The mother, Mrs. Ella Piercy, 64, finally was taken to the city hospital, but after remaining a short time, was removed to the Marion county infirmary. Effort is being made today to find a place for her in a home for the aged.

Fines of \$1 and costs were imposed on the four children by William H. Faust, judge pro tem, and were suspended in each case and the defendants placed on probation.

Those fined were Arthur Campbell, 830 Daly street; Mrs. Charlotte Koons, 725 Lord street; Mrs. Mary Williams, 732 Harrison street, and Mrs. Goldie Drake, 541 South Keystone avenue. Charge of vagrancy against Mrs. Margaret Campbell, wife of Arthur, was dismissed on motion of the state.

The son was ordered to pay \$2 weekly for his mother's support. Mrs. Drake and Mrs. Williams were ordered to pay \$1 each. Mrs. Koons, mother of five children, who testified that the family is living on charity, was excused from payment.

Mrs. Drake testified she had been paying \$1 weekly and aided Mrs. Williams in paying a \$76 hospital bill incurred by the mother. She accused her brother, Arthur, of failing to contribute, although he bought an automobile. He admitted ownership of the car in court.

Mrs. Campbell was arrested after a chase of a block by police who suspected that she intended to warn her husband that officers were looking for him.

On her order, Fred W. Vehling, funeral director and former Marion county coroner, sent an ambulance to her home in which Mrs. Piercy was taken to the home of Mrs. Koons, who refused to receive her, as did the other daughters.

MINE WAGE PARLEY AGAIN IS CALLED OFF

Workers in State Shafts Balk at \$4 Basic Pay.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind., June 16.—Negotiations between operators and members of District No. 11, United Mine Workers of America, looking toward a wage agreement to supplant that which expired March 31, again have been broken off. The \$4 a day basic wage agreed to between operators and a miners' subcommittee, subject to approval of district No. 11, had been rejected categorically by the miners' scale committee, Abe Vales, president of the district, announced. Positive rejection of the proposal, which would have effected a 34 per cent reduction from the \$6.10 scale of 1931, cancels the planned referendum among mine locals, which was to have been held Friday. Vales announced.
