POWERFUL GIANT RACKET! JOHN FREDRICK

Democratic Candidate for Governor Assails Hikes in Taxation.

Political racketeering has usurped government, both state and national, John E. Fredrick of Kokomo, candidate for the Democratic nomination for Governor, declared Thursday night in an address over a state-wide radio hookup.

Cost of government in Indiana has increased eighty millions of dollars in the last ten years, Fredrick declared.

"I defy any one," he said, "to point to an adequate service that we have received that would justify such increase of taxes or expenditure of money."

While expenditures and taxes have increased, the earning power of our people have been lowered gradually until today they have disappeared entirely, but the government expenses are mounting continually, with the attendant result that we are confiscating our people's homes and property today and this to support a government of extravagance that yields no adequate service to its people.

"In face of these facts," the speaker asserted, "we can reach but one conclusion as to the character of our government today, and that is that it is a political racket; its main purpose being not to promote the welfare of the masses, but to enrich a few who have parasitically fastened themselves upon the taxpayer's pocketbook."

If elected and given a government of the "good citizens of Indiana," Fredrick pledged himself "to squeeze the graft and political racketeering extravagance out of our government."

"I will reduce the size of the state government of Indiana to such an extent that we can again put it in the statehouse where it belongs and whose commodious quarters it never should have been permitted to outgrow," he promised.

"The controlling factor of our economic life today are greed and fear," Fredrick asserted, "two attributes of the human mind and heart that always spell disaster when allowed to control individual, group, social or economic life."

"What we must do is to substitute intelligent direction of the economic forces and courageously face the need of change in our economic policies. The change that is essential is the placing of the human being, his needs and his wants, as the objective of our economic system which we have employed in the past."
