Convention Is Adjourned Until Tonight After Vote Deadlock.

One element in the Texas delegation felt that Roosevelt had the nomination "in the bag."

Another felt the contrary, and argued that talk of Garner being offered the vice-presidential place was propaganda from Roosevelt sources to influence the delegation to a friendly position toward the Roosevelt column.

Some delegates were seeking to test home sentiment, telegraphing constituents for counsel and advice.

The Illinois delegation, another "not spot" in the fight for delegates plans for caucus tonight.

Garner showed the most second-ary strength on the third ballot when he went to 10½ after having had Texas and California's total of 90 votes and a quarter vote from Illinois for the first two ballots. He picked up on the third the 11 votes which were leaping about.

Smith, meantime, dropped from 20½ on the first to 19½ on the third.

Smith on the third lost 2½ votes in New York; 9 in Pennsylvania.

Ritchie, the white hope of the stop Roosevelt forces, picked up on the third ballot 2½ votes in Pennsylvania, and ended with a total of 23½.

Baker, another potentiality of the stop Roosevelt folks, went through the three ballots unchanged at 8½, contributed by Indiana 8 and Pennsylvania 1½.

ELKHART, Ind., July 1.—A stroke of luck and quick dealing obtained for Walter Compton, 21, Elkhart, a specially built Rolls-Royce touring car, once owned by the late President Woodrow Wilson.

Compton, a Princeton university student, was in Washington just before returning home for his summer vacation. Attracted by the elaborate car in a salesroom show window, he made inquiries and learned of its history. He immediately made a deal to purchase it for \$300.

Returning to complete the contract the next day Compton found two Mexican generals and a congressman, who had learned of the car being for sale, attempting to overbid him.

The car was presented to President Wilson in December, 1923, by a group of admirers.

KENTUCKY WILL JOIN INDIANA IN RITE AT BRIDGE

\$2,000,000 Evansville Span to Be Dedicated at 3-Day Party.

EVANSVILLE, Ind., July 1.—This city is being decorated today in preparation for the largest three-day community celebration ever held in this part of the state.

Occasion is dedication of the new \$2,000,000 bridge, which links Indiana and Kentucky between Evansville and Henderson, Ky.

The celebration starts Sunday and will continue through Tuesday.

Governors Harry G. Leslie of Indiana and Ruby LaFooth of Kentucky will deliver the dedicatory addresses. Monday a monster street

show and fireworks display are on the program.

Arrangements have been made for 2,000 at a banquet at the Memorial Coliseum Monday night.

Thousands of guests are expected to attend the various affairs, including state highway commissioners and department officials.

The new bridge cost \$2,079,866.24, without about \$50,000 still to be spent on construction of approaches. The main bridge has a total length of 5,395 feet and a road width of 30 feet between the curbs.

The structure provides a navigation clearance of 45 feet above the highest recorded flood stage, which was in 1913. Main piers are approximately 175 feet high and the highest steel extends 110 feet high.

A wind tunnel similar to those used in testing airplanes has been installed at Pittsburgh, to test streamlined locomotives and street cars.

The bridge was financed jointly by Indiana and Kentucky and represents the largest expenditure ever made by the two states combined.

Kentucky issued bonds to pay its share with federal aid and \$25,000 in state highway funds. The Kentucky bonds are to be paid off with tolls, after which the bridge will be free.

Tolls will not be collected during the celebration, however.
