

UNION MINERS FOIL EFFORTS TO OPEN PITS

Operators Fail in Attempts
to Run Shafts With
Unorganized Labor.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind., July 1.—Peaceful pleadings of Indiana's union coal miners appeared today to have won for them a decisive victory over operators who had attempted to open their shafts on a non-union basis.

For three successive days, union pickets talked to crews of men intent upon resuming operations in the pits; on each occasion the workmen returned to their homes. H. M. Ferguson, operator of Crown Hill No. 6 and Submarine No. 2, two of the largest in the Clinton field, today announced that he would make no further effort to open his shafts.

"I'm going to take a one-year vacation trip abroad," he said, "and unless there have been marked

changes in the situation, my mines won't open during that time." Each of the mines employs from 300 to 500 men. Hugh Shirkie, operating Shirkie No. 1 and No. 2 mines, and the Tighe shaft, said he was undecided what action to take. He likewise has been checked in efforts to resume operations this week. Abe Vales, president of district No. 11, United Mine Workers of America, denied reports that renewed consideration of a union wage scale to supplant that which expired March 31 was under consideration between miners and operators.

ADMITS PART IN HARLEM KILLING

Man Given Death Stay by
Baby Case Confession.

NEW YORK, July 1.—Frank Giordano, condemned murderer, reprieved fifteen minutes before he was supposed to have died in the

electric chair, won twenty-four hours more of life by confessing to participation in the Harlem baby killing. Last July an automobile load of gangsters cruised down East One Hundred Seventh street, sprayed the sidewalk with machine gun bullets, directed at a rival gangster. A 5-year-old child was killed; three others were wounded. In his confession to Warden Lewis Laws of Sing Sing, Giordano named the late Vincent Coll, his assassin's gang chief, and Fats McCarthy, gangster, as the other occupants of the car. Coll and Giordano were tried for the baby killing, but were acquitted.
