COURT RULINGS MAY HIT AIMEE FOR \$250,000

Evangelist Faces Possibility
of Paying \$5,000 for
Davy's Case.

LOS ANGELES, July 12.—Aimee Semple McPherson Hutton, 41, in her palatial Moorish castle at Lake Elsinore, faced today the possibility of being forced to pay more than a quarter of a million dollars, as the result of two court judgments and a suit yet to be tried.

The Evangelist found herself involved in efforts to collect a \$5,000 breach of promise judgment won by Mrs. Myrtle H. St. Pierre from her husband, David L. Hutton.

Lorin Andrew, attorney for Mrs. St. Pierre, announced that if Hutton is "broke," as he claimed, community property—in this case Mrs. Hutton's—will be attached.

Mrs. Hutton herself recently lost a \$10,000 damage suit brought by Harvey Gates, scenario writer, who claimed he had been employed by the evangelist.

Today, the hell of Angelus Temple must file an answer to a suit for \$240,000 brought against her in July, by J. Roy Stewart, motion picture director. Stewart was a joint defendant in the Gates action. He claimed in his suit against Mrs. Hutton that the evangelist agreed to act in a film to be called "Clay in the Potter's Hands" and that she failed to keep the agreement.

THOMAS DENOUNCES BOTH OLD PARTIES

Roosevelt's Liberalism Is Called
Only Do-Nothing Attitude.

NEW YORK, July 12.—Both the Republican and Democratic party platforms are "conservative," Norman Thomas, Socialist candidate for President, charges in the bulletin of League for Industrial Democracy.

Denouncing Governor Roosevelt's "liberalism" as a do-nothing attitude, Thomas analyzed the major party platform and candidates and concluded:

"These major party political conventions are just episodes, and not very important episodes at that, in the political struggle of our time. They illustrate the appalling weakness of the capitalist version of democracy. One encouraging thing is, however, that the people are less fooled by this bunk than ever before.

"Our great fight is for Socialism. Our enemy neither is the Republican or the Democratic party. It is Fascism, last-stand of capitalism, which sweeps on with the aid of the old parties or despite them. Its march is aided by the profound distrust of millions of our fellow citizens that anything vital can be done by politics."

DRUNK DRIVER TO FARM

Young City Man Sentenced to 60
Days by Criminal Judge.

Convicted of driving an automobile while under influence of liquor, Ralph McCoy, 21, Monday was sentenced sixty days on the state farm by Criminal Judge Frank P. Baker.

He also was given a six months farm sentence when found guilty of failure to stop after an accident, but this was suspended.

McCoy was charged with hitting an automobile, driven by T. Tyra Bass, on Emerson avenue, June 1. McCoy's car swerved across a lawn and crashed into a porch. Police later arrested him in a poolroom where "he was sleeping in a drunken condition," they testified.
