

STORM SWEEPS OVER LAKE AND FISHERMEN DIE

Sudden Gale Wrecks Frail
Craft; Death List May
Reach Fifteen.

PONTIAC, Mich., July 22.—Placid waters of Pontiac lake were dragged today for the bodies of four to fifteen fishermen sent to water graves when lightning, hail, and a sudden windstorm lashed the waters into a fury.

More than a hundred fishing boats were on the two-mile lake, whiling away a sultry afternoon.

At least five of the scores of row-boats, flatbottoms and canoes were swamped. Some occupants struggled to shore.

One man's body was recovered. Four others were known to have been drowned. And Sheriff Fred Schramm, who led the search today, said he believed eight had been drowned.

A flash of jagged lightning and a crack of thunder were the first warnings of what was to come. Rain fell, and with it came hail. There was a concerted rush for shore.

Then came the wind. It ripped across the lake, and in a moment the placid surface was transformed into a boiling, churning mass.

High waves tossed the boats about as though they were egg shells. Darkness that came with the storm added to the confusion. Screams and cries for help could be heard above the wind's roar. The wind and waves defeated each rescue attempt from shore.

A half hour after the storm broke, it had passed. Broken boats lay on the shore, and a few floated upside down.

BOYS SAVE TRIO FROM DROWNING

Indianapolis Lads Drive
Boat Through Storm.

Two Indianapolis youths drove their speedboat through a half storm late Thursday afternoon to rescue three persons clinging to the bottom of an overturned sailboat in Lake Maxinkuckee.

They were Norman Perry Jr., 17, son of Norman Perry, owner of the Indianapolis baseball club, and Francis Riley, 18, brother of Walter J. Riley, secretary of the ball club.

Mary Crawford and David Cooper of Terre Haute, and a man whose name could not be learned, were saved from drowning.

Finding the sailboat passengers, in grave danger of drowning, the Indianapolis boys rescued first Miss Crawford, then Cooper, and finally the unknown man.


A separate trip had to be made for each rescue, as the capacity of the speedboat would be overtaxed by more than three occupants.

PEACE MEETING IN GENEVA HALL ENDS IN FIGHT

Italians Charge Insult by
French; Delegates Are
Near Blows.

GENEVA, July 22.—International bitterness broke out in the Halls of Peace at Geneva today and a physical combat narrowly was averted.

The French and Italian delegates to a meeting of the interparliamentary union, held in a hall adjoining the world arms conference, exchanged insults and the meeting broke up in disorder.

Pierre Renaudel, French Socialist delegate, insulted the Fascist regime, and Carlo Costamagna, Italian deputy, spiritedly took up the defense of Mussolini.

The meeting was adjourned while peace efforts were made by other

delegations, and Italo Balbo, Italian minister of air, conferred with Mussolini by telephone.

The Italians demanded an apology, but Renaudel said he never would apologize. He had disparaged

Fascist rule as being parliamentary and in the heat of the dispute had referred to the Matteotti murder, fighting words to a Fascist.


