

LAST TOAST IS DRUNK TO CIVIL WAR VETERANS

Lone Survivor of Club, Ill and Feeble, Honors His Departed Comrades.

STILLWATER, Minn., July 22.—For perhaps the last time Charles N. Lockwood has raised his glass in a toast to his departed comrades—the thirty-four other members of the famous "Last Man's Club."
The aged veteran, ill and feeble, said today he feared he could make no more pilgrimages to the historic meeting place of fellow veterans of the civil war.
Lockwood drank Thursday night, for the third time alone, the toast, first proposed in just thirty-seven years ago at a company reunion of the First Minnesota volunteers regiment.
The toast was drunk in water. Lockwood sat alone at a long table in Lowell inn, built on the site of the old Sawyer house, where the reunions were held each year. About the table were thirty-four chairs,

draped in black, one for each of the original members.
In the center of the white cloth stood the bottle of fine old wine, placed in a vault in 1885 to be opened and drunk by the last man.
As veterans of more recent wars looked on, Lockwood rose to attention. From a faded list he called the roll. Then he spoke the well-remembered words of the poem to his comrades:
"The comrades smolder—ashes fall
"The clouds are black against the sky;
"No fan of drums, no bugle call;
"My comrades all, good-bye."
A moment of silence, then followed a bugle call, and Charles Lockwood, soldier, stiffened in proud salute.

LEGISLATORS IN DAZE OVER TWO BUDGET BILLS

Ways and Means Committee Can't Make Up Mind on Measures.

Although no women are included in its membership, the house ways and means committee today considered usurping a feminine prerogative by changing its view on the proposal to slice all state appropriations 20 per cent.
Two bills are pending before the committee. One, the Crawford measure, calls for the 20 per cent

slash, while the other provides only for a 10 per cent reduction. The larger cut is supposed to enable a \$1,600,000 saving and the latter \$800,000.
The committee, so far unable to decide which it will approve, is due to report Monday.
The Bates bill, which would abolish the present tax exemption of state and governmental unit bonds, failed to pass in the house late Thursday, 47 yeas to 43 nays.
Opponents of the bill said if the tax-free clause were removed from governmental bonds it would be necessary to increase the interest rate in order to obtain sale.
Abandonment of township high schools upon petition of a majority of the residents is provided in a bill which has passed the house. The author is Amos F. Nelson (Dem.), Thortown.
First "error" of the special session occurred Thursday when the Wilson bill, taxing theaters 10 per cent of admission and requiring a 50-cent license fee, was reported on the

house floor for passage by Representative Fabius Gwin (Dem.), Shesha, despite the ways and means committee recommendation to withhold action. The bill was returned to committee.
The house Thursday killed a measure which would have prohibited court sale of real estate to satisfy judgments under \$1,200.
A bill to reduce the state forestry levy from 2 to 1 mills, also was killed in the house.
By a vote of 64 to 26 the house passed the anti-lobbying bill which would make a criminal offense any attempt to coerce or threaten members of the general assembly.
