

BRIGHT SPOTS of Business

**Break at Winnipeg Brings
Out Renewed Sales
Pressure.**

CHICAGO, July 30.—After a strong mid-day bulge had carried wheat prices fractionally above the previous close on the Board of Trade today, renewed selling pressure broke the market more than a cent on the way down.

Strength in stocks was a factor in the upturn but the undertone was easy and a 2 cent break at Winnipeg brought in selling. Corn was easy from the start, but held to a narrow range.

Corn Is Lower
Oats showed resistance on further export talk but eased with wheat. Rye followed the major grain fractionally.

At the close wheat was 1/2 cent lower, corn was 1/2 cent lower and rye 1/2 cent lower. Provisions were lower with hogs and corn. Liverpool rallied briskly to close unchanged to 1 cent lower. Argentine weather was reported unfavorable, while rains are checking harvest in parts of Europe. Crop reports from the northwest are spotty. Cash prices were unchanged. Receipts were 117 cars.

Corn Sells Down
Corn was off fractionally with wheat, with the decline checked by buying against the market. The recovery was not impressive and at mid-session prices still were 1/2 to 1 cent lower. Bookings were 42,000 bushels. Cash prices were 1/2 to 1 cent lower. Receipts were 130 cars.

Oats lost a small fraction in sympathy with the major grain, but mid-morning was unchanged to 1/2 cent lower. Trading was largely featureless. Rye was off 1/2 to 1 cent, recovering with wheat from the opening bid. Cash oats was unchanged to 1/2 cent higher. Receipts were 116 cars.
