

FEARFUL PARTY BOSSES WATCH SILENT LEADERS

Admit Much Depends on Words of Borah, Smith, Couzens, Others.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 23.—Backstage, but important, political figures are giving party campaign managers anxious moments these days because of what they may or may not do between now and the presidential election.

A large number of electoral votes may hinge upon either the action or inaction, words or silence, of such men as Governor Gifford Pinchot of Pennsylvania, Alfred E. Smith of New York and Senators William E. Borah of Idaho, Hiram Johnson of California and James Couzens of Michigan.

All are dominating, dynamic and influential figures whose sphere of influence is either large or consequential in certain areas.

The active personality in this category now is the lanky and pugnacious Pinchot, who is sharpshooting at President Hoover because the Reconstruction Finance Corporation won't advance his state a relief loan.

The others are silent and inactive, and there are political strategists of one party or the other who fervently hope they will continue to remain silent or come out and say something definite.


