

UNOFFICIAL WAR RAGING THROUGH SOUTH AMERICA

250 Reported Dead in Fight
Between Paraguayan,
Bolivian Troops.

By United Press
War, undeclared but actual, is
flaming through the southern hemi-
sphere, making South America a
battleground over thousands of
miles of territory.

One undeclared war, another civil
war and growing fear of a third in-
ternational conflict defy the peace-
ful efforts of Pan-American diplo-
mats.

At least 250 Bolivian and Para-
guayan soldiers were reported killed
in the two weeks' battle raging
about Ft. Boqueron, in the disputed
Gran Chaco frontier region.

The rich Brazilian state of Sao
Paulo, which on July 9 rose against
the federal government and de-
manded a return to constitutional
procedure, continued today to hold
most of its territory, although
hemmed in by federal troops.

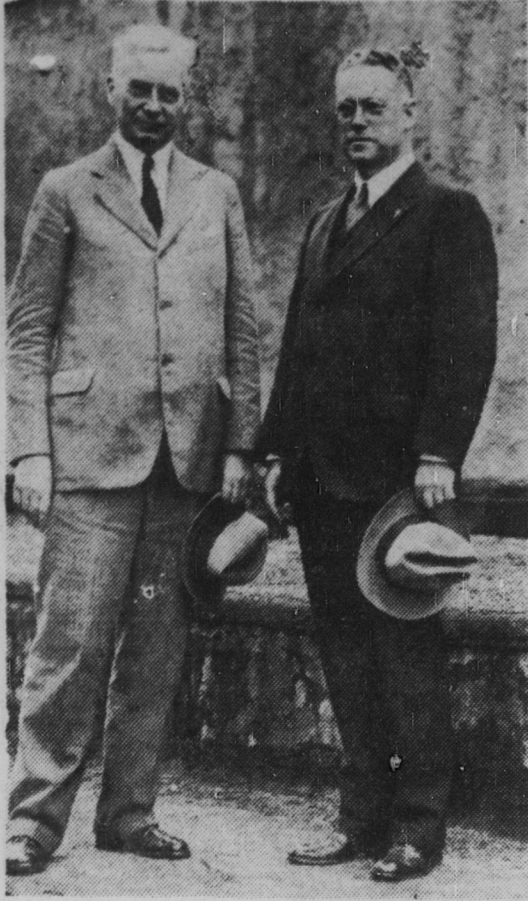
The third trouble spot is in the
northwest, where Colombia and
Peru were squabbling over territory,
with feeling in both countries highly
inflamed.

Colombia was reported sending
troops to Leticia, a small border
town on the headwaters of the Ama-
zon river which Peruvian radicals
seized ten days ago. Leticia was
given to Colombia by a boundary
treaty negotiated several years ago.

NATION NEEDS 'GREAT POEM,' HOOVER THINKS

Christopher Morley Obtains
Unique Interview at
White House.

NEW YORK, Sept. 23.—"No one
can live here without wanting to
do his best. Even men of little
stature have been lifted above
themselves."

Thus Christopher Morley, author,
critic, poet, and one-time newspaper
columnist, quotes President Hoo-
ver's comment on his life in the
White House, given as the two sat
together in the executive mansion
in Washington, chatting on books
and life.

With his wife, Morley spent a
night at the White House as the
President's guest. His experiences
are vividly recorded in an article
in the current issue of the Satur-
day Review of Literature, published
Thursday.

"Perhaps what this country needs
is a great poem," he quotes the
President as saying, "something to
lift people out of fear and selfish-
ness."

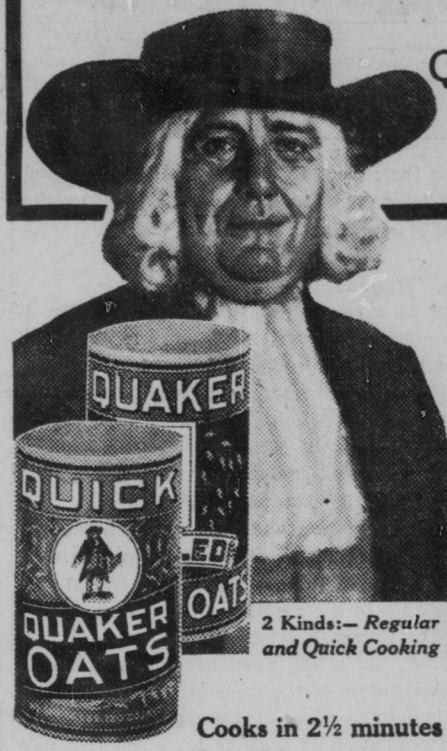

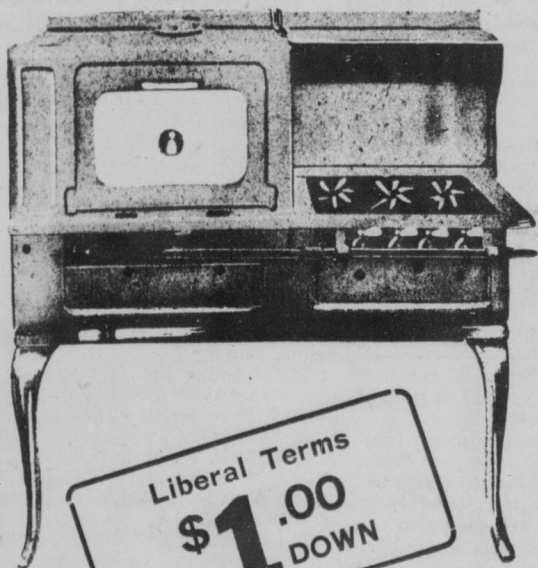
