

32 ARE FREED IN PRINTCRAFT LOTTERY CASE

Words Battle Waged by
Cameron and Police
Sergeant at Hearing.

Verbal by-play between Sergeant Edwin Kruse and Municipal Judge Clifton R. Cameron marked dismissal in a municipal court Wednesday of thirty-two persons arrested following a police raid on the Printcraft Company, alleged lottery, at 23 North Pennsylvania street, a month ago.

Two of the defendants freed were Clarence P. and A. J. Hornberger, alleged lottery heads, who faced charges of operating a lottery and keeping a gaming house.

The word battle between Kruse and Cameron occurred after Kruse had testified to circumstances attending the raid Dec. 2. Kruse related that Clarence Hornberger was alone in the office as the police squad entered.

"Waiting for a Year"

"Well, we're here," Kruse said he told Hornberger.

"Yes, so I see. I've been waiting for you for a year," Kruse quoted Hornberger as saying.

"If he's been waiting for you for a year why haven't you arrested him before?" Cameron asked Kruse. The latter did not answer.

"You know he has offices on Ohio street, don't you?" Cameron asked Kruse.

"Where?" answered Kruse, drawing out a pencil and pad.

"That's your duty to find out," Cameron retorted.

Two Fail to Appear

"As a citizen and taxpayer don't you want to do your duty?" Kruse asked the judge.

"I'm not the chief of police," Cameron answered.

"Neither am I," Kruse rejoined.

After ordering dismissal of thirty-two defendants, Cameron ordered rearrest of Marion King, 230 North New Jersey street, and Dave Stahl, 428 North Alabama street, two other defendants who are alleged to have failed to appear for trial.
