

FRED GALLOWAY IN MAYOR RACE

Five-Cent Street Car Fare
Promised by Candidate
for Nomination.

Announcing his candidacy for mayor on the Democratic ticket, Fred S. Galloway, Marion county representative, today offered a platform including public ownership of utilities, a more extensive park and

playground program, and a 5-cent street car fare.

Galloway, serving his third term in the house of representatives, held an organization meeting Wednesday night at his home at which labor unions and Negro vote groups were represented.

Galloway's platform also includes a pledge to "divorce the city police and fire departments from politics," promotions to be based on efficiency and years of service. Also in connection with the police and fire departments, Galloway proposes a restoration of the 15 per cent salary cut which has been made.

of a sales tax can finance the move. A sales tax also is essential to raise immediate revenues to balance the state budget, he reiterated.

The Governor admitted that with

the taking over of the school costs, financed by a sales tax, the tax becomes something more than an emergency measure, "unless new revenue sources can be found."

McNutt previously has supported the sales tax only as an emergency measure.

Wages will be based on a 160-day (eight-month) school year. Minimum wage payments to common school teachers will be \$800 and \$1,080 to high school teachers.

Teacher allotment will be based on one teacher for each thirty-five pupils in the common schools and one to twenty-five in the high schools.

Payments would be made by the state auditor in January and June, upon figures presented by local schools to the superintendent of

public instruction. The school census will be based on average daily attendance.

There are about 14,000 common school teachers now on the \$800 minimum scale and about 2,000 high school teachers on the \$1,080 rate, it was estimated.

In the house the bill was sponsored by four Democratic representatives—Edward H. Stein, Bloomfield, majority floor leader; Frank Finney, Martinsville; J. Frank Regester, Bloomington, and Marc G. Wagener, Franklin.
