

HOSTILE HOUSE MAY HOLD UP BANKING BILL

Glas: Measure Passed by Senate, 54 to 9, After Long Filibuster.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 26.—The Glass bill for far-reaching banking reforms has passed the senate, and today is being sent to a hostile house amid echoes of Senator Huey Long's exultant cry "get the carcass out of here."

"We killed it, take it away," the Louisiana Kingfish shouted Wednesday night as twenty-one days of filibustering senate debate ended, and the measure passed by 54 to 9. "We don't care now. It's dead, and you can't breathe life into it. It has been de-bunked. De-horned and de-otherwise amputated."

"This bill hasn't any more chance of passing the house than I have of becoming pope, and I'm a Baptist," Long said, and smiled.

Senators are convinced Long is right as far as this session is concerned, even though the house is controlled by the Democrats and the author of the measure, Senator Carter Glass (Dem., Va.), is the party's foremost authority on banking legislation.

Chairman Henry B. Steagall of the house banking committee has indicated he may not even hold hearings on the bill.

The bill, product of nearly two years' work by Glass, would restrict diversion of federal reserve credit to speculative markets; permit limited branch banking by national banks; create a liquidating corporation to aid depositors of closed banks; and require separation of all federal reserve members banks from security affiliates within five years.

DR. MANION TO TALK ON TAXATION MONDAY

Notre Dame Professor to Give Address at Tabernacle.

COSTIGAN PLAN FOR RELIEF IS GIVEN SENATE

\$500,000,000 Measure Is Reported Favorably by Committee.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 26.—The senate manufactures committee voted in a brief session today to report favorably to the senate the \$500,000,000 Costigan-La Follette relief bill.

It was understood several members of the committee planned to offer amendments to the measure when it comes up for senate consideration.

The bill provides that 40 per cent of the proposed relief funds be distributed among the states on a population basis in the form of direct grants.

The remaining 60 per cent would be distributed for emergency purposes where federal and state funds are incapable of meeting the needs.

A federal board, headed by the chief of the children's bureau, would be set up to handle the relief program provided under the bill.

END ARGUMENT IN NEW RIVER POWER DISPUTE

Constitutionality of U. S. Water Control Act Is at Stake.

ALEXANDER, Va., Jan. 26.—Federal Judge Luther Way may announce his decision in the New river case, involving constitutionality of the federal water power act, at the end of two weeks.

Following extensive re-arguments here he has taken the case under

advisement again. Whether or not New river is navigable, whether the federal power commission has a right under the commerce clause of the Constitution to regulate power projects on New river as a tributary to a navigable stream if not itself navigable; and whether regulatory provisions of the water power act are constitutional on any class of streams.
