

BARBER STARTS LIFE TERM FOR CAFE SLAYING

Jury Finds Plymouth Man Guilty After Two Hours of Deliberation.

PLYMOUTH, Ind., Jan. 27.—Convicted on charges of murder and sentenced to life imprisonment, Virgil Barber, 26, was an inmate of Michigan City state prison today.

A jury in Marshall circuit court found him guilty of killing Arthur Pratt, Plymouth restaurant owner, after two and one-half hours of deliberation.

Death had been demanded by prosecuting attorneys but the jury recommended life. Barber visibly was pleased when Judge A. B. Chapman accepted the jury's recommendation.

Pratt was killed the night of Nov. 14, in the rear of his restaurant. Jealousy over a girl was blamed for the slaying at first, but attempts were made later to show that Barber and Pratt were connected with a narcotics ring.

During the trial defense attorneys attempted to prove Barber insane.

CONVICT BOBO IN MURDER OF FORMER WIFE

Jury Verdict Calls for Life Term: Woman Had Served in Prison.

MARION, Ind., Jan. 27.—A jury in Grant circuit court Thursday night found Roy Bobo, 43, guilty on charges of murdering his former wife, Mrs. Oda Lippens.

Bobo escaped the death penalty which state's attorneys had asked when the jury returned a verdict charging second degree murder instead of first. The verdict calls for life imprisonment.

During his trial, Bobo was pictured as a physical wreck, be-

cause of his service in the World war.

He testified the shooting was done in self-defense after his mother-in-law, Mrs. Anna McClain, threw a vase at his head, and his former wife had threatened him with a butcher knife.

Mrs. McClain was wounded.

Mrs. Lippens was killed Dec. 3 at her home here where she lived with her mother.

A short time previously she had

finished serving a term in federal prison on charges of participating in a fake matrimonial agency.

Bobo fled after the shooting and surrendered several days later to Bennington (Vt.) police. He described himself as an ex-cowboy and said he wanted to go back and "face the music."




