

STATE OFFICIAL DELEGATION OFF FOR INAUGURAL

Strange Air of Hush Over
Capitol as Governor's
Party Leaves.

"The tumult and the shouting dies,
The captains and the king depart."

This couplet of Kipling well may be used to describe the statehouse today, with Governor Paul V. McNutt and his henchmen having departed for Washington for the inauguration.

The legislature still is in session, but after these many weeks of acting under marching orders from the Governor's office, the legislators appeared too exhausted to take advantage of the adjournment.

"When the cat is away, the mice will play."
Nothing untoward is expected to happen, although McNutt has an airplane at Washington so he can return in four hours if necessary.
With more major legislation

passed and signed than in the whole previous history of the state, McNutt entrained for the national capital Thursday night.

Previous to departure, he held a conference with Speaker Earl Crawford of the house, and Lieutenant Governor M. Clifford Townsend, senate presiding officer, to arrange details of procedure during his absence.

Only minor details of the immense administration legislative program remain dangling and these are expected to be disposed of quickly today or Saturday.

Adjournment Saturday night is being considered, but it appeared likely that the regular date, Monday, will mark the sine die finish.

The Governor's party en route to Washington included Mrs. McNutt, Thomas D. Taggart, Indiana Democratic national committeeman, and Miss Lucy Taggart, Mr. and Mrs. W. Richardson Sinclair, and Mr. and Mrs. Frank McHale.

ROOSEVELT CAN CALL CONGRESS TO JOB QUICKLY

Special Session Could Meet
Within Few Hours After
Inauguration.

WASHINGTON, March 3.—Franklin D. Roosevelt can, if he so desires, call a special session of congress to meet within a few hours after he takes office as President Saturday.

There is no legal requirement that time elapsed between the call for a session and its convening, according to Senator George W. Norris (Rep., Neb.), chairman of the senate judiciary committee, and other congressional lawyers.

On several occasions in the history of the country a new congress

has assembled, and started work March 4.

In 1869, when Ulysses S. Grant took over the presidency from Andrew Johnson the new President convened congress immediately in a special session which lasted approximately six weeks.

William McKinley and William H. Taft both convened congress eleven days after taking office.

President-Elect Roosevelt may convene the new congress on Monday, March 6, to enact emergency legislation having to do with the banking situation, according to rumors here.

BOOZE ARRESTS WILL CONTINUE

Provisions of Liquor Control Law to Be Enforced, Says Prosecutor.

Marion county bootleggers must continue to "live in fear of the law," regardless of repeal of the Wright bone-dry law, Prosecutor Herbert E. Wilson said today.

Arrests for manufacture and sale of liquor will be made under provisions of the new liquor control bill, he asserted.

Penalties for violations, ranging from \$10 to \$1,000, are not as severe as in the Wright measure.

A prior statement by Wilson that only drunken drivers and public drunks could be convicted was made before he had studied a copy of the liquor control bill.

Only authorized dealers, hotels, clubs, restaurants, answering provisions for licensed dealers, will be

free from the law's interference, Wilson said.

The prosecutor still has authority to close alehouses by filing public nuisance charges.

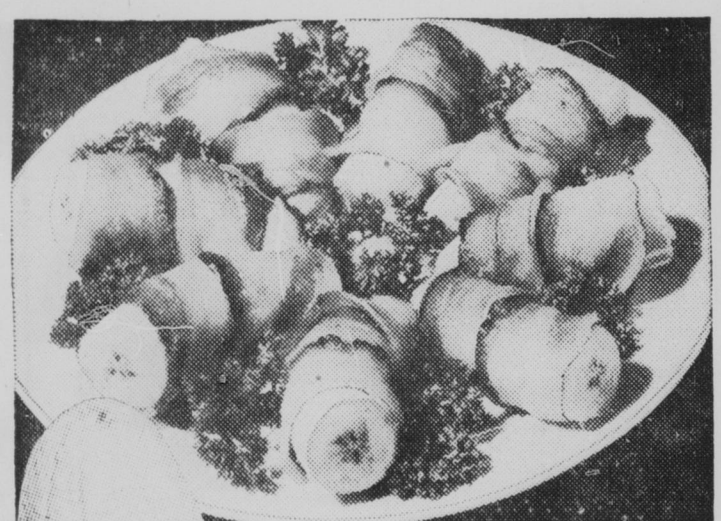

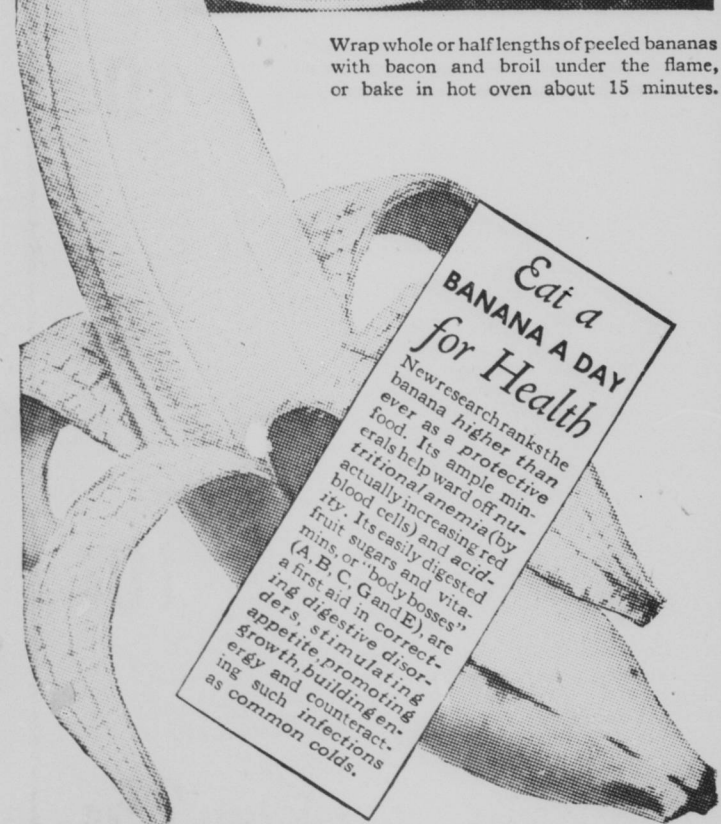
