U. S. DISBURSING OFFICER GONE; START SEARCH

Lieut.-Col. Young Missing Since March 20; on Job Since 1926.

CITY HOME IS LOOTED

Mysterious disappearance of Lieutenant-Colonel Robert T. Young, United States disbursing officer for the Indiana national guard, is being investigated by both state and national governments, it was learned today.

Colonel Young disappeared from the office of Adjutant-General Elmer F. Straub at 10:30 a.m. on March 20, an hour after representatives of the comptroller-general's office prepared to audit his books.

He lived at 2815 Walker avenue, and his wife, who was at the adjutant-general's office Thursday, said she did not know his whereabouts.

Colonel Young is a retired regular army officer, having had thirty years in the regular service, including both the Spanish-American and World wars.

A native of Noblesville, he took a commission in the guard in 1923 and rose to the rank of lieutenant-colonel on the division staff. He has been disbursing officer, a full-time position in the adjutant-general's

office, since 1926, having been appointed by Adjutant-General William H. Kershner, under the regime of former Governor Ed Jackson.

Ralph C. Hale, representing the comptroller-general's office, and his assistant, L. F. Fossdale, are conducting the audit.

It was learned that two years ago, in a similar investigation, findings were satisfactory.

Young handled between \$5,000 and \$15,000 in federal funds monthly and around \$130,000 during the annual guard encampment.
