Forty Rounds Arranged for Armory Mitt Bill Tuesday.

Henry Hook, popular bantam, formerly of Elwood, but now living in Indianapolis, has signed to appear on next Tuesday night's Armory fight card and his opponent will be Lee Norton of Cincinnati. Hook has been "stealing" shows here and in other cities recently and many fans predict he will be boxing in main events before long.

There will be forty rounds scheduled for Tuesday, with three ten-round matches constituting a triple feature and two prelims, a six and a four. The trio of tens is as follows:

Young Holmes, who is carded to clash with Billy Frick, boasts of wins over such boys as Jackie Stewart, Jess Calhoun and others. Last week he fought Roughhouse Blankenship of this city at Cincinnati and had the "rough one" on the floor four times.

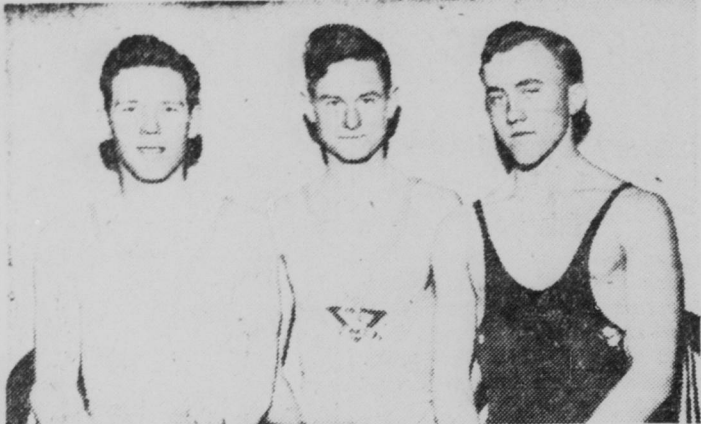

Zehr, 16-Year-Old Hoosier, Takes A. A. U. Swim Crown

NEW YORK, March 31.—The famous Spence family of swimmers added two titles and a third place to their aquatic laurels at the opening session Thursday night of the three-day National A. A. U. swimming championships in the New York A. C. pool.

Walter Spence, oldest of the three New York brothers, won the 200-yard free style final; Wallace Spence, the middle brother, took the 300-yard individual medley title,

and young Leonard finished third in the 100-yard final.

A 16-year-old from Ft. Wayne, Indiana, Danny Zehr, easily won the 150-yard back stroke crown, and Richard Degener from the University of Michigan, won the low-board diving championship.

The New York A. C. leads for the team trophy with 13 points. Michigan is second with 8 and the Ft. Wayne Y. M. C. A. third with 5.

The swimmers compete today in the 220-yard free style, 220-yard breast stroke and the 400-yard relay.

Butler in Easy Win

Sears, Bradford and Tauer Take Two Firsts in Track Meet.

ST. LOUIS, Mo., March 31.—Paced by Sears, Tauer and Bradford with two victories each, Butler U. of Indianapolis captured first place in eleven of fifteen events to win their first outdoor dual track meet of the season here Thursday. The Hoosier Bulldogs defeated Washington U. of St. Louis, 82 to 49. Washington won the mile relay, high jump, javelin and discus events.

Ray Sears captured the half mile and mile races, Tauer the 100-yard dash and 120-yard high hurdles, and Bradford the 220-yard dash and 220-yard low hurdles.

Zehn added a first in the 440-yard dash, and Love, Boaz and Feltner of Butler all tied for first in the two-mile run. Ewing took the pole vault for the Hoosiers, while Cosgrove scored five points in the broad jump. Elser tossed the shot 43 feet, 8 inches for a first. Butler placed second in nine events.

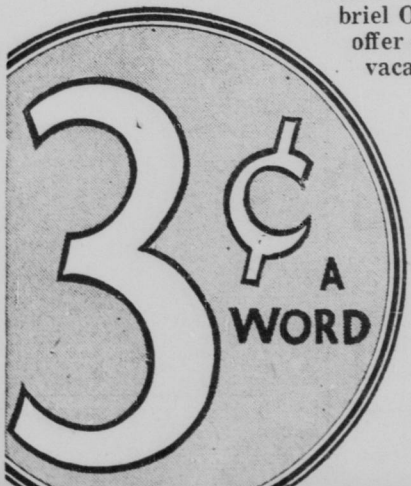
