ACTION NOW UNLIKELY ON WATERWAY TREATY

Roosevelt Informed Ratification Is Impossible, Is Belief.

WASHINGTON, May 16.—Joseph T. Robinson, senate Democratic leader, today threw cold water on the hopes of proponents of the St. Lawrence waterway and power project when he said:

"I do not anticipate that the treaty will be disposed of during this session."

That short statement, made following a conference with President Roosevelt at the White House, is considered by some observers as "the beginning of the end" of the seaway controversy.

The senate leader refused to divulge what wishes the President had expressed, but it is understood Mr. Roosevelt asked for ratification in the special session, and was informed that it was unlikely, if not impossible, that the necessary two-thirds vote could be obtained.

WOMAN DEAD AS RESULT OF AUTO MISHAP

Mrs. Mary Faubion, 79, Is Victim: Hit by Car While Crossing Street.

Marion county's growing traffic death rate gained momentum today when Mrs. Mary Faubion, 79, of 514 East drive, Woodruff Place, died at city hospital from injuries she received Monday afternoon when she was struck by an automobile at Michigan and Randolph streets.

Death of Mrs. Faubion, widow of J. L. Faubion, brought Marion county's toll since Jan. 1, to forty-five. Thus, if the traffic death rate thus far in 1933 continues, the total for the year will be 120, against ninety-six in 1932. The 1931 total was 176.
