experiences of his own, while on an expedition last winter in the Bahamas. Equipped with only a diving helmet and in his bathing trunks, he descended more than a hundred feet. The ocean fish darted about him, as he walked along, examining his surroundings for specimens for the museum he was assisting.

"Occasionally, a huge fish would come rippling through the water and look right into my eyes through the helmet," Montgomery said. "It was a queer feeling; I felt that I really should have said something apologize for my intrusion."

Kick Isn't Difficult

The kick wasn't really so hard. Grasping a small floating board in my hands and with my face under water, I followed Montgomery's instructions by kicking my feet and legs from my hips.

You mustn't bend your knees, Montgomery explains that the principle of swimming is to move so that your body offers little resistance to the water. When the knees are bent in kicking, you just do a lot of work and don't get anywhere. And that wouldn't be much fun in this hot weather.

WEAPONS USED BY STONE AGE MAN EXCAVATED

Data on Dwellers in Rhine Valley Is Aim of Search.

BERLIN, July 7.—Lions were among the beasts at which hunters of the Old Stone Age in Germany cast their spears. Evidence to this

effect, in the shape of a fine skull of a lion, has been found at what seems to have been a hunting place of Ice Age date near Wallertheim in the Rhine region. The discoverers, Professor Otto Schmidtgen, director of the Mainz museum of natural history, and Dr. Wilhelm Wagner of the Darmstadt Geological Institute, have been conducting a systematic search for evidences of paleolithic populations in the Rhineland.

The hunting-place where the lion skull was found seems to have been a water-hole where the animals came to drink, and where consequently their shaggy hunters could lurk among the bushes with fair hopes of spearing a dinner. Tools of both stone and bone were discovered here, the latter a great variety among Old Stone Age artifacts.
